TRANSPORTATION COMMITTEE REPORT relative to establishing a permanent ceremonial sign which reads "Bishop E.L. Holmes Square" at the northwest corner Westminster Avenue and 7th Avenue in Venice.

Recommendation for Council action, pursuant to Motion (Galanter-Svorinich):

INSTRUCT the City Engineer to initiate proceedings to designate the intersection of Westminster Avenue and 7th Avenue in Venice, and the Department of Transportation (DOT) to erect a permanent ceremonial sign, tan in color with brown lettering (as currently designed by the DOT) on the northwest corner which reads "Bishop E.L. Holmes Square" in honor of the memory and achievements of Bishop E.L. Holmes.

<u>Fiscal Impact Statement:</u> None submitted. Neither the City Administrative Officer nor the Chief Legislative Analyst has completed a financial analysis of this report.

Summary:
