EDUCATION AND NEIGHBORHOODS COMMITTEE REPORT relative to discontinuing the use of the term "South Central Los Angeles" on all City documents.

Recommendation for Council action, pursuant to Motion (Perry - LaBonge):

REQUEST all City departments to discontinue the use of the term "South Central Los Angeles" on all City documents and replace this phrase with the term "South Los Angeles" as documents are updated and printed.

<u>Fiscal Impact Statement</u>: Neither the City Administrative Officer nor the Chief Legislative Analyst has completed a financial analysis of this report.

#### **Summary:**

At the April 1, 2003 meeting of the Education and Neighborhoods Committee, the Committee considered Motion (Perry - LaBonge) relative to discontinuing the use of the term "South Central Los Angeles" on all City documents. The Committee recommended adoption of the Motion.

During the Committee's discussion, a Council District(CD)9 representative reported that the term South Central Los Angeles stems from the term South Central Avenue. As a geographical term, South Central Los Angeles has shifted around as the African - American community has moved west. The term South Central Los Angeles now indicates a neighborhood of any kind where the African community tends to congregate. The CD 9 representative stated that it is a disservice not only to the term South Central, which was the hub of the African - American community in CD 9 for many years, but it implies that any area in the City of Los Angeles, regardless of where it is, where a number of African - Americans congregate, is stamped South Central. He further stated that as African -

Americans have continued to move north and west, the term South Central has followed that community into West Adams and other areas of the City where the term South Central is not appropriate.

A representative from the Planning Department stated that there is a South Central Community Plan, but changing the name of the Community Plan would not affect the Plan boundaries. He stated that the Planning Department had no objection to the name change. The Planning Department representative additionally state that there is the South Central Alcohol Beverage Ordinance which affects more than just the South Central Community Plan area. He stated that an Ordinance would most likely be necessary to change the Ordinance name.

Chair Hahn expressed support of the Motion. Ms. Hahn stated that this name change is supported by many community members who have said that the term South Central Los Angeles has a negative connotation. Ms. Hahn also stated that the media seems to use the term particularly when reporting negative events occurring in completely different Los Angeles communities and thereby lumping the various communities together as South Central Los Angeles. Ms. Hahn stated that communities want and deserve respect and if a term or name gives a negative connotation, it should not be used.

At its meeting of April 1, 2003, the Education and Neighborhoods committee recommended adoption of Motion (Perry - LaBonge) relative to requesting all City departments to discontinue the use of the term "South Central Los Angeles" on all City documents and replace this phrase with the term "South Los Angeles" as documents are updated and printed. This matter is now forwarded to the Council for its consideration.

# MOTION & NEIGHBORHOODS OEC 1 8 2002

At the turn of the 20<sup>th</sup> Century, African-Americans migrated from various parts of the United States to the City of Los Angeles seeking employment opportunities and a better quality of life. There was a time period in which residential restrictions allowed people of color to live in only certain areas of the City. As a result, South Central Avenue evolved into a well known street that African-Americans congregated for various reasons. In this area of the City a large number of African-Americans lived and shopped. During this period in time, South Central Avenue became known as "South Central."

At one point South Central Avenue was host to the African-American experience. Many African-American men worked as blacksmiths, barbers, cooks, handymen, teamsters and pullman porters; the women labored as domestic servants or practical nurses. A few African-Americans owned and operated restaurants, barber and beauty shops, and night clubs on South Central Avenue. Also, there was an increase in the membership rolls of local churches. This gave rise to superior African-American choirs, which were known for singing great gospel music. In the period before and after World War I, musicians and bands spent their off-hours performing at hot spots on South Central Avenue.

The term "South Central" has been used to describe almost every section of the City where there is a high concentration of African-Americans. After the 1950s, the African-American community began to drift westward towards Crenshaw Boulevard. Even though the area surrounding South Central Avenue is no longer predominantly an African-American community, the term "South Central" has followed the community westward and has a negative connotation following the 1965 and 1992 civil disturbances.

Council District 9 and the Cultural Affairs Department have conducted public hearings on whether the area surrounding South Central Avenue should be referred to as "South Los Angeles." The general consensus from the public is that the South Central Avenue area should be referred to as "South Los Angeles."

I THEREFORE MOVE that all City departments BE REQUESTED to discontinue the use of the term "South Central Los Angeles" on all City documents and replace this phrase with the term "South Los Angeles" as documents are updated and printed.
