Re: COASTAL TRANSPORTATION CORRIDOR SPECIFIC PLAN (CTCSP) UPDATE

Dear Councilmembers:

While the existing LA Coastal Transportation Corridor Plan has fees for new projects, said fees are vastly different than the new fees proposed under the new Plan. In our case, the new fees are literally 100 times higher than the old fees. Projects that have been submitted to the Planning Department or LADBS long ago should not suddenly be subject to completely new fees 100 times higher than at filing. The fees that were in effect at the time of filing should apply to those projects, and the new fees should apply to new projects. The new fees are so different and in our case literally 100 times higher that they would prevent the project from moving forward, that after two years of entitlements and LADBS approvals.

Other new fees like the city's linkage fee have always included language exempting projects that have already been submitted prior to the new ordinance. Torpedoing a project after two years of approvals with immensely higher fees seems contrary to the city's overall intent and can easily be remedied by including typical language that exempts projects that have been deemed complete, for which a decision on a discretionary action has become final, that have been submitted for plan check and for which plan check fees have been paid long ago.

The Los Angeles City Council will conduct a public hearing regarding the proposed updates to the Coastal Transportation Corridor Specific Plan (CTCSP) and West Los Angeles Transportation Improvement & Mitigation Specific Plan (WLA TIMP).

The CTCSP and the WLA TIMP are two existing Specific Plans that established development impact fee programs on the Westside. The City of Los Angeles will hold a Public Hearing regarding proposed updates to these two Specific Plan fee programs, in accordance with the Los Angeles City Charter and the State Mitigation Fee Act (Government Code Section 66016).

Currently, the two existing Specific Plans assess development impact fees on new commercial and industrial development. The proposed amendments would update the fees and would include a fee for new residential development. Existing housing and affordable housing would not be subject to fees. The impact fees are intended to mitigate the impacts of new development.

The updated Specific Plans include updated development impact fees and updated lists of transportation improvements to be funded, in part, by the fees.
