Re: *Item 3, Sign Ordinance*

Dear Councilmembers:


I am writing this letter to express my concerns about the following items within the proposed sign ordinance:

- The ordinance does not contain a mechanism that would enable the permitting of signs, banners and off-site signs at city-owned facilities and city parks. I believe we are missing a critical opportunity to create possible revenue through signage at city facilities and I think this issue should be addressed in the comprehensive sign ordinance.
- The proposed ordinance contains prohibitive threshold requirements for establishing sign districts. As you know the current draft ordinance is requiring a project to be 15 acres and/ or 5,000 linear feet of street frontage to be eligible for a sign district. I understand City Planning's intent to limit sign districts to destination areas but believe the threshold should be reduced to a more reasonable scale such as 2,640 liner feet of street frontage (1/2 mile). I believe the reduction will meet City Planning's intent but help to ensure that dense, urban areas like Downtown and South Los Angeles are not left behind.
- The current draft ordinance takes a confusing position on grandfathering provisions for pending and existing sign districts regarding sign reduction credits and community benefits. I ask that City Planning clarify this provision and offer transition language for pending and existing sign districts.

I appreciate the hard work that City Planning has put into crafting this ordinance and realize that these issues are complex with many competing factors. To that end, I am supportive of creating a sign unit within City Planning and look forward to working with the Council and the Mayor to make it a reality.
