

This list is way overboard and without the due process which should be afforded the Citizens and Taxpayers of the City of Los Angeles .

You have also bypassed the system chartered through Commissions or elected, by the Voters, through the Bond Oversight Process. Have you outreached to the Neighborhood Councils yet?

Included on this list are Los Angeles Unified School District (LAUSD) school construction projects, which have Department of State Architect oversight and a Bond Oversight Committee. Schools are under the State Constitution, not the City Charter.

This is ugly, folks. The Mayor's duties are not chartered for all these projects listed.

Solar LA is listed here. This project has not been vetted by the Department of Water and Power, a proprietary department, not under the control of the Mayor. Council President Eric Garcetti has withheld a report, unveiled by David Zahniser from the LA Times.

Why are you hiding information from the public? What hikes are facing the Ratepayers, including the Public Entities?

You have a Taylor Yard Transit Village , yet you are in jeopardy of losing US Army Corp of Engineers jurisdiction over the Clean Water Act and navigable waters. Is development more important to you? Do you just need more rooftops for Solar LA because you do not have the open land needed for such a project?

Will the LA River projects from the LA River Revitalization Master Plan (LARRMP) jeopardize the ability for future federal funding, not just this initiative?

You insist on replacement pools such as Downey and Lincoln Park because it will enhance the value of the property around the area and the USC Biomedical Park and the LA River developments. What about the kids? Is a high end Surfrider necessary in a poor area? What about the health care costs, or is that the County's problem and not yours?

What are projects like "LA River Bikeway Solar/LED Retrofit? Any public hearings held yet?

Just what are those projects at the Zoo? The Pachyderm Forest is in controversy. Do you care?

Are some of the Water Recycling and Supply Projects in line with the preferences established in the Greater LA County Integrated Regional Water Management Plan's (IRWMP) Project List?

Did you bother to consult those sub-regional groups in any manner?

When did the MTA become a City agency or department? Why are their projects listed here?

You think there are going to be jobs, but have you analyzed the availability of such work. Heavy construction is on overload, we understand. Is that all you have to offer in this? Where is the timeframe? Are the Operation and Maintenance costs covered by the Budget already or will there be future tax, fee or rate hikes?

What is the ownership of the land involved? Is it public land or private land? Why is the taxpayer being burdened with improvements on privately-held land?

Where is the CEQA required documentation of this report?

Is it helter skelter or is there a real Plan?
