**reports as follows:**

INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY AND GOVERNMENT AFFAIRS COMMITTEE REPORT relative to development and implementation of a plan to best service the senior constituents while identifying efficiencies and savings.

Recommendations for Council action, as initiated by Motion (Cárdenas – Koretz):

1. INSTRUCT the City Administrative Officer (CAO) and Chief Legislative Analyst (CLA) to report back to the Arts, Parks, Health and Aging Committee relative to the line item description of services, policies and programs provided by the Los Angeles Department of Aging (LADOA) and the Department of Recreation and Parks (RAP). The report must include the number of staff assigned to programs, targeted population by geography, source of funding, goals and objectives of the services provided by the department.
2. INSTRUCT the Community Development Department and the Department on Disability to participate in this process as needed.
3. INSTRUCT the LADOA and RAP and the CAO to implement a plan that addresses efficiencies and savings while maintaining service to senior constituents and reduces potential liability.

Fiscal Impact Statement: Neither the CAO nor the CLA has completed a financial analysis of this report.

Community Impact Statement: None submitted.

Summary:

At its meeting held on February 16, 2010, the Information Technology and Government Affairs Committee considered a Motion (Cárdenas – Koretz) that referred a recommendation from the City Administrative Officer's Three-Year Plan to Fiscal Sustainability, regarding development and implementation of a plan to best service senior constituents, to the ITGA Committee. During the discussion of this matter, representatives from the CAO and LADOA provided an overview of a proposed plan to deliver City services for senior constituents and responded to related questions from Committee members. After further consideration and an opportunity for public comment, the Committee recommended to approve the recommendations detailed above. Fiscal Impact Statement: Neither the City Administrative Officer (CAO) nor the Chief Legislative Analyst has completed a financial analysis of this report.


