report as follows:

TRADE, COMMERCE, AND TOURISM COMMITTEE REPORT relative to the Los Angeles Convention Center (LACC) privatization proposal contained in the City Administrative Officer Three-Year Plan to Fiscal Sustainability report.

Recommendations for Council action, as initiated by Motion (Hahn - LaBonge):

- 1. DIRECT the City Administrative Officer (CAO) to report on the following:
 - a. Retention of bond counsel to advise the City Council on whether the LACC's taxexempt bond status allows the City to privatize the management and operations of the LACC.
 - Financial expectations for the privatization proposal, including whether the City is seeking upfront financial commitments, capital investments, or revenue sharing proposals.
- 2. INSTRUCT the working group consisting of CAO, City Attorney, Chief Legislative Analyst (CLA), LACC, and Mayor's Office to study short-term governance proposals that can be implemented immediately and to report back to the Trade, Commerce, and Tourism Committee with updates.

<u>Fiscal Impact Statement</u>: Neither the CAO or the CLA have completed a financial analysis of this report.

Community Impact Statement: None submitted.

SUMMARY

At a regular meeting held on February 17, 2010, the Trade, Commerce, and Tourism Committee considered Motion (Hahn - LaBonge) relative to the LACC privatization proposal contained in the CAO Three-Year Plan to Fiscal Sustainability report. An opportunity for public comment was held. After a brief discussion, the Committee moved to approve the recommendations contained in Motion (Hahn - LaBonge) and instructed the working group to study and report back on short-term governance proposals that can be implemented immediately. This matter is now forwarded to the Council for its consideration.
