Dear Councilmember Parks:

At the request of the Budget and Finance Committee, we are providing the attrition numbers (enclosed) for the last four fiscal years in order to identify trends. After analyzing the data there were no significant spikes other than Pay Period No. 24 of Fiscal Year 2006/07. During that pay period, the first mandatory Deferred Retirement Option Program (DROP) separations occurred. Aside from that spike, the only noticeable trend was that the second quarter of the fiscal year consistently garnered the least amount of attrition. This may be contributed to the holidays and/or tax liability. If an employee retires in January (third fiscal quarter) when they receive their payout, it decreases tax liability for that year as they will be earning less due to retirement.

The average attrition for the last four fiscal years is as follows:
