At out June 20<sup>th</sup>, 2019 meeting, the Del Rey Neighborhood Council considered the topic of dockless vehicles and data sharing.

Previously, the Council took a position advocating for ride sharing data (as it pertains to vehicles) and in prior hearings concerning dockless vehicles highlighted the existing City plan to gather data.

While we respect the need for privacy of end users, dockless companies are part of our public transportation fabric, and they use public spaces to conduct their business. To better understand how these vehicles complement our transportation system, and to look towards comprehensive management of all the pieces of this network, generic data gathering is crucial. Further, State interference in this matter is both out of place and uncalled for.

Therefore, at the June 20<sup>th</sup>, 2019 Board Meeting of the Del Rey Neighborhood Council, the Board voted 10-1 (Gupta opposing) to adopt the following motion:
