As the President of the Park Mesa Heights Community Council (PMHCC), I'm writing to express my disappointment to the lack of certain operations surrounding the Liquor Bank. The PMHCC has not voted

as a Board to support the revocation of this store's conditional use permit, so I will take this time to write

as an Individual that resides in the Park Mesa Heights Community.

Despite the apparent use of security personnel, years of complaints and requests by the

community, members of the Neighborhood Council and City officials, this store fails to operate in such a

manner as to prevent unlawful activities and nuisance behavior.

There is a great deal of loitering throughout the day and evening hours of operation; trash and

alcohol containers litter the sidewalks; continuous illegal vending; harassment of passersby; disturbances

of the peace; illicit activity, including the consumption of alcohol, sell and use of marijuana, and

disruptive behavior that literally spills over into the streets into on-coming traffic as well as the adjacent

residential area. The owners of the store and its proximity to the LAPD Traffic Division have had little if

any impact on deterring this activity. The continued operation of the Liquor Bank imposes dangers to

Public Health and Safety of persons shopping or visiting the premises and degrades the surrounding area,

and negatively impacts the community's quality of life. We therefore ask you revoke the store's

conditional use permit.
