Detective Bureau DNA Quarterly Report. 3rd Quarter September 30, 2010

PURPOSE

Robbery-Homicide Division (RHD) has been asked to provide a written report and remain available to provide a monthly verbal report to the Los Angeles City Council and the Public Safety Committee, as it relates to the reduction of the backlog of the DNA Evidence Kits. This is the third quarterly report for 2010. The progress report is posted and updated on a monthly basis on the Department's website by the 10th of each month. This action will enhance our verbal monthly report.

BACKGROUND

In September of 2008, the City Controller's Office published a report regarding the status of all Sexual Assault Evidence Kits (SAEK) booked into evidence at the Los Angeles Police Department's (LAPD) Property Division. The report revealed 7,495 SAEKs had not yet been analyzed. As a result, the LAPD conducted a physical audit of all SAEKs booked at Property Division. The LAPD's audit revealed that there were 11,077 SAEKs in evidence, and 6,132 SAEKs had not been analyzed. The 6,132 SAEKs became the "Historical Backlog."

A monthly DNA report has been developed with the corroboration of the Controller's Office, the City Attorney's Office, Councilmember Eric Garcetti's office, and a multitude of victim advocate groups. The monthly report documents efforts to reduce the Historical Backlog and provides month to month progress.

PROGRESS

As of September 30, 2010, 152 SAEKs from the Historical Backlog are in the process of being analyzed. It is anticipated that the testing of these remaining SAEKs will be completed near the end of October 2010. Of the 4,755 cases analyzed, the LAPD has uploaded 1,453 forensic unknown profiles into the Combined Offender DNA Index System (CODIS). Additionally, from the 4,755 cases analyzed, there have been 358 named offender hits and 33 case to case hits. Of the case to case hits, some include forensic unknowns, while others include named offenders identifying possible sexual assault serial offenders. These results do not include the analysis efforts of the SAEKs booked post December 8, 2008.

From July 1, 2009, to September 30, 2010, total funds spent for outsourced SAEKs analysis has accumulated to \$5,932,762.

Previously allocated grant funds totaling approximately \$3.5 million has been anticipated as sufficient to address the needs of the Department to complete of the "Historical Backlog" technical reviews. Additional grant funding has been sought for peripheral testing circumstances and review of previously tested SAEKs that may yield a proficient profile due to DNA technology advancement.

We will continue to look into more funding due to peripheral testing issues, such as, confirmation analysis and consensual partner eliminations.

We are continuing our efforts to increase the staffing within our DNA/Serology Unit to handle the incoming analysis requests. The "Managed Hiring Committee" has approved the hiring of 14 more DNA staff by the end of October 2010. Interviews were conducted for four Laboratory Technicians a few weeks ago. Four selections were made pending medical and background investigations. The remaining positions to fill are entry level criminalists. The Department will interview and fill these positions when the Personnel Department releases the new certification list of eligible candidates in early November. This should be completed by early December 2010.

Robbery-Homicide Division is in the pilot phase of a patch work tracing system as a temporary solution to integrating several feeder legacy systems. This system has a limited application and does not fill the requirements of a comprehensive tracking system. The Department has identified potential funds and is preparing correspondence requesting City Council approval to use those funds for and Request for Proposal to hire a consultant to conduct a system needs assessment. Concurrent with that effort, is a search of any existing information technology consultant currently under contract that might meet the system consultant needs. This dual approach will push forward to identify and hire a consultant to identify the tracking system parameters.

CONCLUSION

The Historical Backlog has been reduced from 6,132 to 152 SAEKs. The last of the SAEKs associated with the Historical Backlog were sent out to an outsource laboratory for analysis. The anticipated completion of the "Historical Backlog" should be documented in the October Monthly DNA Report. Continued procedures will be performed on completing the necessary technical reviews of data reports to ensure any profile of evidentiary value will be uploaded to CODIS. To efficiently respond to crimes involving DNA evidence, the Department will continue to outsource SAEKs as funding permits, and with our increased staffing at SID, train personnel for increased "In-House" DNA analysis.
