Detective Bureau DNA Quarterly Report- 3rd Quarter 2012 October 1, 2012

PURPOSE

The Los Angeles Police Department's (Department) Robbery-Homicide Division (RHD) and Scientific Investigation Division (SID) have been asked to provide a written report and remain available to provide monthly deoxyribonucleic acid (DNA) verbal reports to the Los Angeles City Council and the Public Safety Committee, as it relates to the reduction of the backlog of the Sexual Assault Evidence Kits (SAEKs). The SAEK Progress Report is posted and updated on the Department's website monthly.

BACKGROUND

In September of 2008, the City Controller's Office published an audit regarding the status of all SAEKs booked into evidence at the Los Angeles Police Department's Property Division. The Department revised the serology request procedures to process all the Historical Backlog and all incoming SAEKs booked into the Department. In April of 2011, the Historical Backlog was completed. In January of 2012, a revised monthly SAEK Progress Report was developed to demonstrate our continued efforts to ensure that incoming SAEKs are accounted for and completed in a timely manner.

PROGRESS

At the end of the 3rd Quarter of 2012, the Department had 236 SAEKs booked into custody awaiting completion. Of the 236 SAEKs, all were in-process for analysis with the exception of 13 SAEKs that were pending a request from the investigating officer. There were 37 SAEKs that had been in-process for over 90 days, and of those, only 12 were over 120 days. Currently, none of the SAEK analysis requests have been in-process over 150 days.

From July 1, 2012, to September 30, 2012, the Department has completed the analysis of 429 SAEKs. Of the 429 SAEKs, 305 were outsourced while 124 were completed in-house. Fiftynine SAEKs have been reviewed and deemed unsuitable for testing. During this time period, the Department uploaded 281 profiles into CODIS and received 66 CODIS hits. Regular database reconciliations can result in minor differences between a summation of the individual months and the overall quarterly figures.

The Department is in the process of completing the retest efforts on 228 identified SAEKs that were deemed complete by 2008 standards. At the end of this quarter, 219 of the re-tests have been completed with only nine remaining retest SAEKs in-process.

During this quarter, the funds spent for outsourced SAEKs were tabulated at \$446,361. From July 1, 2009, to September 30, 2012, total funds spent for outsourced SAEK analysis has totaled \$10,174,369.

The SID, Serology/DNA Unit (SDU), has submitted an unfreeze request for a total of 11 vacant positions in the Unit, six of which resulted from promotions in the prior fiscal year.

Detective Bureau DNA Quarterly Report- 3rd Quarter 2012 October 1, 2012

A Request for Proposal (RFP) for the development of a new Evidence and Property Information Management System (EPIMS) was presented and approved by the Police Commission on September 18, 2012. The RFP has been released, with a pre-proposal conference scheduled on October 18, 2012. Proposals will be due to the Department on January 3, 2013. Information Technology Bureau reviewed the timeline and updated the time frames based on previous systems implemented. The time frame estimates for the proposal process, vendor selection, and contract negotiations was increased from six months to require at least eight to 12 months. The implementation of such a complex management system would be expected to progress in phases and require approximately 18 to 24 months for completion. The early cost estimates for such a comprehensive system easily exceed one-million dollars for which there is not an identified source of funding.

CONCLUSION

The Department will continue to use DNA evidence to solve crimes. The revised procedures for requesting serology/DNA analysis has ensured that each incoming SAEK will be accounted for with a Request for Serology/DNA Analysis report. The Department will continue to work in partnership with other city entities and victim advocacy groups to develop and improve our work process. The Department will also continue to outsource SAEKs as funding permits, with a continued emphasis on the training of our SDU personnel to increase the "In-House" DNA analysis capability. It is the Department's goal to ensure timely testing of all SAEKs and to reduce our reliance on the outsourcing of DNA analysis.
