#### DISCUSSION

These cases often involve life-threatening circumstances including, kidnappings, critical missing individuals, and criminal cases. This system and its supporting software will not have to be maintained or serviced by Information Technology Division. The system is self supporting and will not be hooked into the Department's LAN system.

There are no extended warranties associated with this donation. There are no licensing agreements with this donation. Any service, repairs, and/or replacement outside of the one-year warranty period will not be the responsibility of the City of Los Angeles or the Los Angeles Police Department. This donation will not be covered by the City's technology service contract. This communications system will not be replaced by the City. This donation will have no impact to the Department's budget, Special Fund(s), and/or General Fund.



Approximately 50% of TSU's activities involve communication monitoring. In 2009, TSU was responsible for locating 33 critical missing individuals and 67 criminal suspects. The use of communication monitoring system saves thousands of man-hours of investigation and provides an inestimable cost savings to the Department and City.
