RE: (CF 10-982) PROTEST TO RAISING DOG AND CAT LIMITS IN LOS ANGELES

I am a resident of **PARK LA BREA**. As your constituent, I urge you to vote "NO" on the motion to raise the number of cats and dogs that can be maintained in households in Los Angeles.

The number of pets in our and other apartment buildings is controlled to assure we will not be bothered by nuisance barking and noise and sanitation issues. Getting people to pick up after their dogs is still a major problem and would be much worse if our neighbors in houses could have up to five dogs each.

Whether people live in an apartment, condominium or a private home, there will be many negative repercussions from ten dogs/cats per property in the surrounding area.

The City needs to enforce the laws that require people to take care of their pets. This will reduce the shelter population and insure humane treatment. Merely adding to the burden of the community is not a way to fix the animal problems and it may make it much worse.
