Dear Councilman Zine and other members of the Public Safety Committee:

As a constituent, I am asking that you vote in favor of the proposed new limits for dogs and cats in the City of Los Angeles.

Increasing limits will:

- 1.) Allow more animals to be adopted from the shelter; thereby saving lives
- 2.) Reduce the costs to city shelters to hold and euthanize these animals
- 3.) Reduce the number of animals surrendered to the shelters
- 4.) Generate additional licensing income for the City of Los Angeles

Increasing limits will NOT result in packs of dogs roaming city streets. This has been supported by results from other areas with similar limits.

In the few instances in the city where hoarding has been uncovered, it has been unrelated to pet limits.

The vast majority of pet owners find the number of pets they own to be self-limiting. Most only

adopt the number of pets that they can provide with good quality care.

Property owners can set their own pet limits. The increase will not affect them.

Surrounding areas (i.e., San Diego, Santa Monica, Riverside County) allow higher limits than what this motion proposes and yet these areas do not report increased problems.

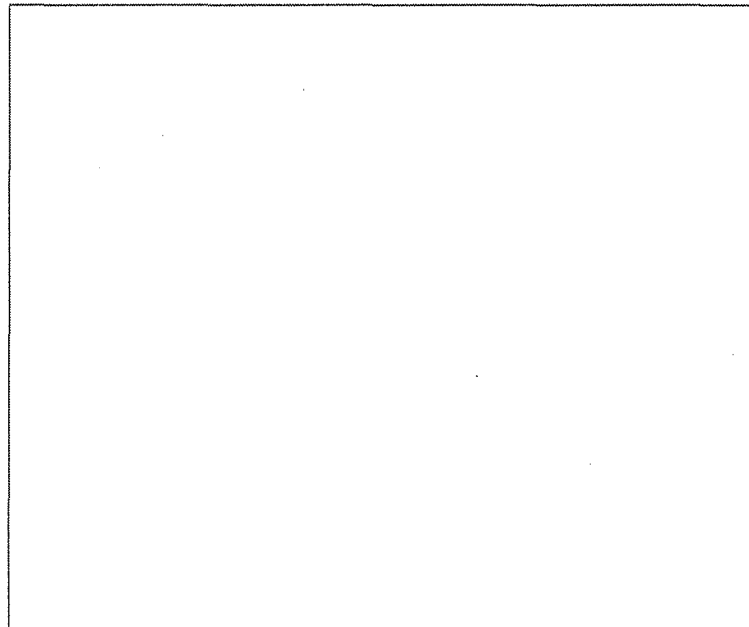

BUDGET AND FINANCE COMMITTEE REPORT relative to the feasibility of dedicating Watts Towers admission ticket proceeds to a reactivated Watts Towers Restoration, Maintenance and Preservation Trust Fund or the Cultural Affairs Trust Fund.

Recommendations for Council action, as initiated by Motion (Hahn – LaBonge):

1. CONCUR with the recommendation of the Arts, Parks, Health and Aging Committee to approve the Motion recommendation relative to instructing the Department of Cultural Affairs (DCA) and the City Administrative Officer (CAO) to report on the feasibility of dedicating Watts Towers admission ticket proceeds to a reactivated Watts Towers Restoration, Maintenance and Preservation Trust Fund or the Cultural Affairs Trust Fund.
2. INSTRUCT the DCA and the CAO to include in the report a clarification of the mandate and guidelines for the use of funds in the Watts Towers Restoration, Maintenance and Preservation Trust Fund and the Cultural Affairs Trust Fund and whether these funds can be used for repair and maintenance costs as opposed to programming expenses.

Fiscal Impact Statement: Neither the CAO nor the Chief Legislative Analyst has completed a financial analysis of this report.

Community Impact Statement: None submitted.

SUMMARY

At its regular meeting held on November 8, 2010, the Budget and Finance Committee considered a Motion (Hahn – LaBonge) relative to requesting a report on the feasibility of dedicating Watts Towers admission ticket proceeds to a reactivated Watts Towers Restoration, Maintenance and Preservation Trust Fund or the Cultural Affairs Trust Fund. According to the Motion, Watts Towers is a set of 17 separate sculptural pieces built on a residential lot. The site is listed on the National Register of Historic Places as one of only four U.S. National Landmarks in the City of Los Angeles. The sculptures were constructed from 1921 to 1955 by Simon Rodia, an Italian immigrant, who used steel pipes and rods wrapped with wire mesh, mortar, porcelain, tile and glass for construction. The intricacy of the sculptures makes the maintenance and conservation of the towers extremely detailed and difficult. In addition, earthquakes and inclement weather have damaged the towers extensively over the years. Currently, the City is responsible for maintenance, preservation and conservation of the Watts Towers.

After consideration and an opportunity for public comment, the Committee recommended that Council adopt the recommendation contained in the Motion and further recommended to instruct the DCA and the CAO to include in the report a clarification of the mandate and guidelines for

the use of funds in the above referenced Trust Funds and whether these funds can be used for repair and maintenance costs as opposed to programming expenses.

This matter is now submitted to Council for its consideration.
