Dear Councilman Koretz, I am respectfully asking you to reject the proposal to allow an increase in animals per household from 3 to 10. As a former owner of two dogs, I can attest to the fact that care and feeding and exercising them several times per day requires lots of dedication, to say nothing of the money necessary to support them. Why would anyone who understands this want more animals in their home? I question the purpose behind the proposal and wonder why it is more important for the City Council to consider this issue than, say, the increasing homeless population, the beggars on the streets, the worsening potholes, the abysmal lack of parking. Those issues are, to me, a lot more urgent than increasing the legal limit of animals per household. I was not aware from anything I've read in the L.A. Times or any other local newspaper that residents were eager to have more animals in their homes. Just exactly what benefit is there to be enjoyed? I personally cannot think of any. I can, however, envision lots of extra noise, smell from uncared for animals, and a gradual downgrading of our lovely community. It's a bad proposal and I hope you will give it a thumbs down.
