INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY AND GOVERNMENT AFFAIRS COMMITTEE REPORT relative to options to allow the City's surface lots in the Van Nuys Civic Center to remain open until 2 am for public use to support the surrounding commercial and retail businesses.

Recommendation for Council action, as initiated by Motion (Cárdenas - Krekorian):

DIRECT the City Administrative Officer (CAO), to work with the Department of General Services, Los Angeles Department of Transportation and any other relevant department, to report on options to allow the City's surface lots in the Van Nuys Civic Center to remain open until 2:00 am for public use to support the surrounding commercial and retail businesses. The report should include information on current expenditures, current costs for maintenance and security, and the incremental cost to extend the hours of the parking facilities.

<u>Fiscal Impact Statement</u>: Neither the CAO nor the Chief Legislative Analyst has completed a financial analysis of this report.

Community Impact Statement: None submitted.

SUMMARY

At its regular meeting held on July 6, 2010, the Information Technology and Government Affairs Committee considered a Motion (Cárdenas - Krekorian) relative to directing the LADOT to report on options to allow the City's surface lots in the Van Nuys Civic Center to remain open until 2 am for public use. According to the Motion, the community adjacent to the Van Nuys Civic Center is supporting efforts to revitalize the area to allow for new, neighborhood-serving businesses. Unfortunately, space for additional parking is severely limited and the City is examining how to provide more parking for new businesses to foster economic development. After consideration and an opportunity for public comment, the Committee recommended to approve the recommendation contained in the Motion as amended to direct the CAO to report back with assistance from GSD, LADOT and any other relevant department. Additionally, the Committee specified that the report should include information on current expenditures, current costs for maintenance and security, and the incremental cost to extend the hours of the parking facilities. This matter is now submitted to Council for its consideration.
