1736 Family Crisis Center (FCC) assists victims of domestic violence, runaway and homeless youth, homeless families, and the unemployed with such services as therapy, legal counseling and emergency shelter. FCC serves approximately 5,000 families, individuals and youth each year. In 2008, the City Council approved Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funding in the amount of \$971,188 for land acquisition and building improvements to allow FCC to open an emergency shelter at a single-family residence in Council District 11 (C.F.10-1235 and 10-1235-S1). During the current construction of the project, unforeseen issues where encountered, including an unsafe foundation which must be strengthened, termite damage, and environmental clean-up. These changes have resulted in the project requiring an additional \$235,000 to be fully constructed and ready for occupancy. The FCC is of great importance to the community and therefore additional funding should be identified so the project can open without further delay.

I THEREFORE MOVE that the Chief Legislative Analyst be instructed to identify \$235,000 in Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) or other sources for the purpose of completing the emergency shelter operated by 1736 Family Crisis Center located in Council District 11.
