You fluctuate annual increases in fees anywhere from 3.9% to 8.49%, not graduated and with no explanation as to how these increases are determined.

Inspection and Control Fees annual increase anywhere from 3.77% to 7.14% across the classes, not graduated and with no explanation as to how these increases are determined.

Septic Disposal Permit Fees annual increases are from 16.67% and graduates down to 7.69%.

SIU Groups annual increase are from 3.99% to 6.52%, not graduated and with no explanation as to how these increases are determined.

The formulas and percentages are confusing. How to you determine such calculations. Do you have measurement instruments, calibrated, accurately measured and logged.

Nothing makes sense.

Just what are your Capital Improvement Plans. The Integrated Resource Plan, certified in December 2007, is obsolete and is not followed.

The Donald C. Tillman Water Reclamation Plant In-Plant Storage Project Environmental Assessment, US Army Corps of Engineers, August 9, 2011 mentions significant changes to the SEWAGE SYSTEM. It is not an adopted plan.

So, what is the real status on infrastructure.

What debt to you plan to incur by these fee, formula and percentage increases.

Where is the vote of the citizens.

Deny this ordinance and ask for a report on the cost basis and fee realization as well as the capital expenditures anticipated and debt-long-term and short-term.

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
