#### BICYCLE PLAN IMPLEMENTATION QUARTERLY REPORT

This quarterly report on the implementation of the 2010 Bicycle Plan provides a summary of the progress made by the Los Angeles Department of City Planning (DCP) and the Los Angeles Department of Transportation (LADOT) between January and June 2012. This report provides highlights of implementation milestones during the past two quarters. For a full list of the programs that DCP and LADOT are implementing, see Attachment 1.

Key efforts highlighted in this report include progress on the Five-Year Implementation Strategy, input from the Bicycle Plan Implementation Team (BPIT), the staffing of a Bicycle Planner in DCP, the kick-off of the Environmental Impact Report (EIR) for the first-year priority projects, the MyFig Project, the bike facility prioritization survey, bicycle parking programs, Bicycle Friendly Business Program, and grant opportunities to support the work of the LADOT Bicycle Program.

#### Five-Year Implementation Strategy

As a means to ensure that the remaining 1,227 miles on the Backbone and Neighborhood networks of the 2010 Bicycle Plan (Plan) could be completed within the next 35 years, the Five-Year Implementation Strategy was established to implement at least 200 miles of bikeways (including bicycle lanes, bicycle-friendly streets, sharrows, and bicycle paths) every five years, or 40 miles per year on average.

#### 1A. Bicycle Lanes:

LADOT crews have already installed 25.95 miles of bicycle lanes between December 2011 and early June 2012, a strong start in meeting the 40 mile target. An additional 17.09 miles of bicycle lanes have been administratively approved and are in the queue for installation.

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Another 3.98 bicycle lane miles have been designed and are under review for approval. An additional 12.50 miles of bicycle lanes are in design. An EIR process is underway to analyze 44.90 miles of bicycle lanes identified as Priority 1 for the first year, which is a package of bicycle lanes that were elevated for review based on the Grading System criteria. For details of these 104.43 miles of bicycle lanes see pages 1 through 7 of Attachment 2.

### 1B. Bicycle-Friendly Streets

Bicycle-friendly streets is a program of the Plan (1.1.4A) that uses a combination of traffic calming, intersection treatments, shared lane markings and signage to improve safety and ease for bicyclists to travel on local and collector streets. LADOT is actively working on 4.2 miles of bicycle-friendly streets in Central LA. These facilities are detailed on page 8 of Attachment 2.

### 1C. Shared Lane Markings (Sharrows)

LADOT is also actively working on 19 miles of new sharrows as listed on Pages 9 and 10 of Attachment 2. Many of these sharrows are proposed on existing bicycle routes (in-road bikeways where bicycles and motor vehicles share the roadway), and will serve to close gaps between existing bicycle lanes or will be the first treatments on future Bicycle Friendly Streets.

### 1D. Bicycle Paths

To expand the current 49-mile Green Network, LADOT is working on 17.89 miles of bicycle path projects along the Los Angeles River, the Orange Line Extension, Exposition Light Rail Line Phase 2, and San Fernando Road. These projects are detailed on page 11 of Attachment 2. The 7-mile segment of the Los Angeles River Bicycle Path, from Griffith Park to Downtown has been designated a National Recreation Trail by the Secretary of the Interior, Ken Salazar, and will be included in the National Trails System.

### 2. Bicycle Plan Implementation and Outreach

### 2a. Bicycle Planner

In early March, 2012, David Somers began work as DCP's new Bicycle Planner. The Bicycle Planner works with LADOT Bikeways Group, other City agencies, elected officials and the general public to implement the programs of the 2010 Bicycle Plan. Specific tasks include: oversee the EIR process for the Bicycle Plan projects that require more extensive environmental review, lead the BPIT meetings and prepare the quarterly and annual reports for the Transportation Committee.

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#### 2b. Bicycle Plan Implementation Team

The Bicycle Plan Implementation Team (BPIT) held its most recent quarterly meeting on Tuesday, April 17, 2012. Participants contributed to discussions on the bicycle priority street network, protected bike lanes, Bicycle Plan monitoring, the identification of the next round of bike priority segments and revisions to the BPIT meeting format. DCP presented an update on the Mobility Element that included ideas for a prioritized street network for cars, transit and bikes and conceptual revisions to the City's streets standards. The Bicycle Advisory Committee (BAC) Chair presented a concept for a new organizational structure that would enable improved public input and coordination for future bike projects.

2c. Environmental Impact Report for the First Year of the First Five-Year Implementation Strategy and the Figueroa Streetscape Project

DCP, in coordination with LADOT, has released a Notice of Preparation (NOP) for an EIR for the First Year of the First Five-Year Implementation Strategy and the Figueroa Streetscape Project (MyFig). The EIR will analyze approximately 44 miles of bicycle lanes that were identified for the First Year Priority as well as the My Fig Project discussed in greater detail below. DCP and LADOT shall hold three public scoping meetings during the NOP period. The Final EIR is anticipated to be completed by the end of 2012.

#### 2d. Bike Facility Prioritization Survey

In December 2011, LADOT initiated an on-line survey to help identify the next round of priority segments. The on-line survey asked Angeleños to vote for their top five bike projects from the Five Year Implementation Strategy. The survey received 180 responses that included Bike Lanes, Bike Routes and Bicycle Friendly Streets (BFS) in four geographic areas (Central, Harbor, Valley, and Westside). The survey responses, along with future discussions with BPIT, the bicycle community and Council Offices will help guide staff in determining the next round of priority segments.

#### 3. Bicycle Parking

For the period of November 2011 through May 2012, LADOT installed 351 Inverted-U bicycle racks in the public right-of-way as part of the Sidewalk Bicycle Parking Program.

In early March 2012, following on the heels of the success of the first bike corral at York Boulavard. last year, LADOT installed the City's second bike corral at the Sunset Triangle Plaza in Silver Lake. In response to growing interest, the LADOT Bike Program has been working with local businesses and council offices to identify additional locations for the Bike Corral Pilot Program. To support this effort, LADOT has created a promotional document that describes what a corral is for businesses that may be unfamiliar with the concept. As part of the Pilot Program, LADOT has developed an application process for local businesses to request that a bike corral be installed in front of their business. A Bike Corral Maintenance Agreement has also been established to clarify bike corral maintenance responsibilities. There is currently interest from over a dozen businesses and LADOT is

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looking to expand the pilot to 10 locations this year. A prefabricated corral is being ordered and a standard design plan is being developed to reduce fabrication and design costs and facilitate future implementation.

#### 4. Encouragement Efforts

#### 4A. Social Media

The LADOT Bicycle Program continues to expand its social media efforts to inform, educate, and seek input from the public. To date, the Bike Blog has received a total of 163,802 views and in May had 12,452 hits, a new record. And, the Facebook page has received 692 "likes." As of May, the Twitter account had 672 followers. The Flickr account has had a total of 72,242 views. The direct links are:

#### 4B. Bicycle Friendly Business Program

LADOT has initiated a Bicycle Friendly Business Program (BFBP) that will enlist business participation in supporting a host of bicycle services. The BFBP includes an adoption program for businesses to maintain adjacent publicly accessible bicycle repair stations (see 5A below), local business discounts to bike corral users, and the development of a Foursquare page. The Foursquare page allows the public to check into bike corrals with their mobile phones to unlock discounts and specials from participating local businesses.

#### 4C. Wayfinding Program - Update

With previous funding from a Metro Call for Projects award, LADOT is working on a new Bicycle Wayfinding Signage Program. The project is meant to encourage bicycling by providing signage that will assist travelers in utilizing their bicycles to travel to local destinations. LADOT is prioritizing the installation of wayfinding signage along Bicycle Friendly Street (BFS) facilities in the Five Year Implementation Strategy and along existing and prominent facilities like the LA River and Orange Line Bike Paths. LADOT conducted four public workshops and released an online survey in February and March of 2012 to garner input from local communities to determine appropriate locations for the signage.

#### 4D. Protected Bicycle Lanes - My Fig Project

With the dissolution of the Community Redevelopment Agency (CRA/LA), LADOT is accepting responsibility for the MyFig Project. With a proposed completion date of 2014, the My Fig project will include the City's first physically separated bicycle lane (cycle track/on-street bike path) on a major roadway. The separated bicycle lanes would extend along S. Figueroa St. from 7th St. to Exposition Blvd. and will also include additional segments on 11th St. from Broadway to S. Figueroa St and Bill Robertson Lane between MLK and Exposition Blvd. This type of facility design is new to California and is being

presented to the California Bicycle Advisory Committee (CBAC, advisory to Caltrans HQ) as an experimental project to add a fourth class of bikeway to the California Highway Design Manual.

#### 5. Funding Applications and Awards

#### 5A. Bikes Belong Grant – Awarded

LADOT Bicycle Program won a \$17,000 grant to create a Bicycle Repair Station Business Improvement Program as part of the BFBP (see 4B above) to foster public-private partnerships between the City and local businesses. The program will install bicycle repair stations in the public right-of-way to allow bicyclists public access to tools and to pump air into their tires.

#### 5B. TIGER IV Discretionary Grant Program - Applied

The LADOT Bicycle Program applied again for a \$18 million grant through the USDOT's Transportation Investment Generating Economic Recovery (TIGER IV) Discretionary Grant program to substantially complete a significant section of the LA River Bike Path linking the Valley to Long Beach. If awarded, the funds would provide a contiguous bikeway corridor creating a true non-motorized transportation network along the Los Angeles River. The project will connect river path segments already built, or under construction, and establish a robust on-street feeder network throughout Downtown LA. To help develop the project, LADOT Bicycle Program assembled a working group consisting of the Bureau of Engineering's River Project Office, Bureau of Street Services, Bureau of Street Lighting, LADOT Grants management staff, the Trust for Public Land and the City of Vernon. If awarded, design would start as soon as fall 2013. LADOT is expecting notification on the funding in June 2012.

#### 5C. State Safe Routes to Schools - Applied

LADOT Bike Program submitted two grant applications to implement Bicycle Friendly Streets near schools. The first project, which will be located in the Valley, creates bicycle/pedestrian friendly corridors via traffic calming treatments along Pierce Street (from San Fernando Road to Glenoaks Blvd.) and Herrick Ave. (from Pierce Street to Brownell) in Pacoima. By creating two intersecting Bicycle Friendly Streets using traffic calming treatments, pedestrians and bicyclists will feel welcomed on Pacoima neighborhood streets. A non-infrastructure program will complement the infrastructure improvements with bicycle safety education and encouragement.

The second project will implement bicycle friendly streets near several mid-city schools along a north-south corridor to make it safer and easier for bicyclists and pedestrians. Treatments will include bike lanes, bulbouts, bicycle loop detectors at signalized intersections, additional shared lane markings, route signage, improved crosswalks, and several programmatic elements to support/encourage students walking/bicycling to school. These will complement already funded elements for the project/corridor, including a

roundabout, and existing shared lane markings. LADOT will be notified by July 1st if the application has been successful.

5D.Office of Traffic Safety - Applied

Staff submitted a grant application to develop a safety program to reduce bicycle falls and car-bicycle collisions through a series of bicycle safety education classes. The classes will be accessible and appealing to novice and at-risk populations. Classes will likely include: Traffic Safety Basics, Bicycle Handling, Learn to Ride, Bikes & Transit, and Shopping by Bike. The program will be geared towards adults and will educate first-time bicyclists, novice users, and recreational bicyclists who lack urban bicycling skills. In addition to educational workshops, a bicycle safety advertisement campaign may also be launched during the second term of the program. Outdoor advertisements will highlight the main causes of bicycle collisions and offer solutions to motorists and bicyclists.

5E. Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP) - Application Pending

LADOT Staff is working on applications for the Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP), a core Federal-aid program established by the Safe, Accountable, Flexible, Efficient Transportation Equity Act: A Legacy for Users (SAFETEA-LU). The funds from this program are directed toward infrastructure-related highway safety improvements for areas with high collision rates. LADOT and DCP staff has mapped the locations with the highest rates of collisions and is developing an application that targets the most critical areas.

### Regional Coordination

Metro has initiated the East San Fernando Valley Transit Corridor study that evaluates transit improvement options along Van Nuys and Sepulveda Boulevards LADOT and DCP staff has requested that a physically separated bicycle lane on Van Nuys Boulevard be studied as an option in the Alternative Analysis.
