RECOMMENDED ACTIONS

1. That the Board of Police Commissioners (Board) REVIEW and APPROVE the attached Application for Special Reward Payment.
2. That the Board TRANSMIT to the Mayor and City Council the Application for Special Reward Payment for review and approval.

DISCUSSION

On March 31, 2011, the victims, Bryan Stow, Matthew Lee, Allen Bradford, and witness Cory Macial attended the opening day game for Major League Baseball between the Los Angeles Dodgers and the San Francisco Giants. All four men wore San Francisco Giants' clothing in support of their team. Following the conclusion of the game, the victims and witness walked toward Dodger Stadium Parking Lot No. 2, in attempt to locate the exit of the stadium grounds. As they entered Parking Lot No. 2, the four men were approached by suspects, Louie Sanchez and Marvin Norwood. The suspects yelled derogatory comments toward the victims because they were wearing Giants' apparel. Unprovoked, suspect Sanchez struck victim Matthew Lee on his temple with a clenched fist then pushed victim Stow, causing Stow to fall into witness Macial. The victims attempted to avoid a confrontation and continued to walk westbound through Parking Lot No. 2.

The four men walked approximately 368 feet from the first encounter between Sanchez and Norwood. Once the four men reached the far west end of Parking Lot No. 2, they looked to their rear and observed Sanchez and Norwood running toward them. Sanchez ran toward victim Bradford and struck him on his face using a closed fist causing him to fall to the ground. Victim Stow's attention was drawn toward Norwood, when Sanchez ran up behind Stow then punched Stow in the left side of his head causing him to fall to the ground. Stow fell instantly to the ground unconscious. As Stow lay on the ground unconscious, Sanchez commenced to kick Stow on his head several times. Norwood also approached and kicked Stow several times. Norwood then stood over Stow, raised his arms and said, "Does anyone else want to fight!" Stow's friends, along with several other citizens in the parking lot, came to Stow's aid and shielded him from any further attack by the suspects.

Sanchez and Norwood then ran away back toward the stadium and entered their vehicle which was driven by Dorene Sanchez (Louie Sanchez' sister). They fled the stadium in Dorene's car among the heavy flow of traffic exiting the stadium. Louie Sanchez, Jr. (Louie Sanchez' son) was also present in Dorene's vehicle.

Bryan Stow was subsequently transported to LAC+USC Medical Center in critical condition with a serious head injury. Stow remained at LAC+USC Medical Center for approximately seven weeks where he remained in critical condition in a medically induced coma. Stow suffered irreversible brain damage and will require full-time extensive assisted living for the remainder of his life.

On April 5, 2011, a \$50,000.00 reward was offered on a motion approved by the Los Angeles City Council for information leading to the arrest and conviction of the person or persons responsible for the attack on Bryan Stow. The case took on massive media attention and was known as the, "Dodger Stadium Beating Case." Over 883 leads were generated during this investigation.

As a result, a witness provided crucial eyewitness accounts of this crime. The witness provided the composite drawing of both suspects and was able to connect both suspects to the crime scene. The witness observed the first altercation between Stow's group and the Sanchez group. The witness also observed the suspects flee the scene and gave a detailed description of the vehicle driven by Dorene Sanchez. With the information that was provided, the investigators were able to connect the Sanchez group to the assault on Stow. This witness was deemed to be a crucial witness by the prosecution. In addition to the above primary witness, there were three others who provided corroborating and eyewitness testimony that was very important to solving this case.

Based on the information provided by the witnesses, the Investigating Officer, Robbery-Homicide Division Detective Barry Telis, Serial No. 25451, along with several detectives and police officers from the Bryan Stow Task Force conducted an extensive follow-up investigation and were able to identify the suspects, Louie Sanchez, Marvin Norwood, and Dorene Sanchez. The suspects were identified by several witnesses, along with admissions made by the defendants. On July 21, 2011, detectives arrested Louie Sanchez, Marvin Norwood, and Dorene Sanchez.

On July 22, 2011, the Los Angeles County District Attorney's Office filed several counts of mayhem, felony battery, and assault with a deadly weapon against Louie Sanchez and Marvin Norwood for the attack on Bryan Stow. The District Attorneys rejected the case against Dorene Sanchez.

On February 18, 2014, the defendants accepted a plea agreement to the following charges: Louie Sanchez pled guilty to one count of mayhem and one count of felony battery, and received nine years state prison. Marvin Norwood pled guilty to one count of felony battery and received four years state prison.

On March 31, 2011, the victims, Bryan Stow, Matthew Lee, Allen Bradford, and Witness Cory Macial attended the opening day game for Major League Baseball between the Los Angeles Dodgers and the San Francisco Giants. All four men wore San Francisco Giants' clothing in support of their team. Following the conclusion of the game, the victims and witness walked toward Dodger Stadium Parking Lot No. 2, in attempt to locate the exit of the stadium grounds. As they entered Parking Lot No. 2, the four men were approached by suspects, Louie Sanchez and Marvin Norwood. The suspects yelled derogatory comments toward the victims because they were wearing Giant's apparel. Unprovoked, suspect Sanchez struck victim Matthew Lee on his temple with a clenched fist then pushed victim Stow, causing Stow to fall into witness Macial. The victims attempted to avoid a confrontation and continued to walk westbound through Parking Lot No. 2.

The four men walked approximately 368 feet from the first encounter between Sanchez and Norwood. Once the four men reached the far west end of Parking Lot No. 2, they looked to their rear and observed Sanchez and Norwood running toward them. Sanchez ran toward victim Bradford and struck him on his face using a closed fist causing him to fall to the ground. Victim Stow's attention was drawn toward Norwood, when Sanchez ran up behind Stow then punched Stow in the left side of his head causing him to fall to the ground. Stow fell instantly to the ground unconscious. As Stow lay on the ground unconscious, Sanchez commenced to kick Stow on his head several times. Norwood also approached and kicked Stow several times. Norwood then stood over Stow, raised his arms and said, "Does anyone else want to fight!" Stow's friends, along with several other citizens in the parking lot, came to Stow's aid and shielded him from any further attack by the suspects.

Sanchez and Norwood then ran away back toward the stadium and entered their vehicle which was driven by Dorene Sanchez (Louie Sanchez' sister). They fled the stadium in Dorene's car among the heavy flow of traffic exiting the stadium. Louie Sanchez, Jr. (Louie Sanchez' son) was also present in Dorene's vehicle.

Bryan Stow was subsequently transported to LAC+USC Medical Center in critical condition with a serious head injury. Stow remained at LAC+USC Medical Center for approximately seven weeks where he remained in critical condition in a medically induced coma. Stow suffered irreversible brain damage and will require full-time extensive assisted living for the remainder of his life.

On April 5, 2011, a \$50,000.00 reward was offered on a motion approved by the Los Angeles City Council for information leading to the arrest and conviction of the person or persons responsible for the attack on Bryan Stow. The case took on massive media attention and was known as the, "Dodger Stadium Beating Case." Over 883 leads were generated during this investigation.

As a result, a witness provided crucial eyewitness accounts of this crime. The witness provided the composite drawing of both suspects and was able to connect both suspects to the crime scene. The witness observed the first altercation between Stow's group and the Sanchez group. The witness also observed the suspects flee the scene and gave a detailed description of the vehicle driven by Doreen Sanchez. With the information that was provided, the investigators were able to connect the Sanchez group to the assault on Stow. This witness was deemed to be a crucial witness by the prosecution. In addition to the above primary witness, there were three others who provided corroborating and eyewitness testimony that was very important to solving this case.

Based on the information provided by the witnesses, the Investigating Officer, Robbery-Homicide Division Detective Barry Telis, Serial No. 25451, along with several detectives and police officers from the Bryan Stow Task Force conducted an extensive follow-up investigation and were able to identify the suspects, Louie Sanchez, Marvin Norwood, and Dorene Sanchez. The suspects were identified by several witnesses, along with admissions made by the defendants. On July 21, 2011, detectives arrested Louie Sanchez, Marvin Norwood, and Dorene Sanchez.

On July 22, 2011, the Los Angeles County District Attorney's Office filed several counts of mayhem, felony battery, and assault with a deadly weapon against Louie Sanchez and Marvin Norwood for the attack on Bryan Stow. The District Attorneys rejected the case against Dorene Sanchez.

On February 18, 2014, the defendants accepted a plea agreement to the following charges: Louie Sanchez pled guilty to one count of mayhem and one count of felony battery and received nine years state prison. Marvin Norwood pled guilty to one count of felony battery and received four years state prison.

It is the opinion of the investigating officer and the deputy district attorney assigned to this case that the testimony of the main eyewitness as well as the other three, resulted in the arrest and conviction of the two defendants.
