At its meeting held on May 15, 2012 the Planning and Land Use Management (PLUM) Committee considered Motion (Huizar - Alarcón - et al) and Motion (Huizar - Alarcón) relative to recommendations for implementing "Clean Up, Green Up" strategies in Boyle Heights, Pacoima, and Wilmington and setting up a trust fund. During this meeting the PLUM Committee had given the departments six months to submit a report back.

Please be advised that the Committee has revised the timeframe for department report back on this matter. The new due date for responses is now <u>August 1, 2012.</u> Please prepare a response as requested by the PLUM Committee. When this matter is scheduled for Committee consideration, your attendance, or that of your designee, is respectfully requested.

Below is a summary of the PLUM Committee actions:

1. Instructed the Planning Department, as the lead, with the assistance of the Departments of Public Works; Community Development Department; Fire Department; Building and Safety; Office of Finance, in consultation with the City Attorney and Project Consultants to report back with recommendations to implement "Clean Up, Green Up" strategies/policy recommendations in Boyle Heights, Pacoima and Wilmington. The report should include, but not be limited to, the following: a) Financial and Planning Incentives; b) Inspection and Enforcement Protocols; c) Administrative Funding Mechanism; d) Design Standards; e) Work plan should outline scope and tasks, schedule, personnel and resource requirements and any necessary budget analysis. It should also specify how the "Clean Up, Green Up" work plan fits within existing department priorities and leverages existing efforts.

- 2. Directed the City Administrative Officer to prepare a report to the PLUM Committee, in consultation with the Planning Department, that provides a cost estimate to implement the "Clean Up, Green Up" strategies/policy recommendations in Boyle Heights; Pacoima; and Wilmington. As part of the budget analysis, the Planning Department should consider that \$100,000 may be available in a trust fund for this work.
- 3. Requested City Attorney to prepare and present an ordinance to create a "Clean Up, Green Up" Trust Fund.
