#### 10. Grant Award Summary

The Office of the City Attorney is requesting approval to accept \$125,000 in grant funding for the Underserved Victim Advocacy and Outreach Program. Following a competitive Request for Proposal process (RFP) Cal-EMA has awarded the City Attorney's Office annual funding for up to five years contingent upon satisfactory program performance and availability of funds. These funds will provide services to victims of crime in the Korean American community with the goal to provide assistance to recover from the psychological, emotional and out-of-pocket financial losses incurred as a direct result of the crime.

The total cost of the program is \$172,050 of which \$125,000 will be reimbursed to the City as follows: \$51,516 in salary expenses, \$15,008 in fringe benefits, \$52,800 in contractual services and \$5,676 in operating expenses. Grant funds will provide full reimbursement for salary and fringe benefits for one position. Matching funds of \$31,250 (volunteer hours \$29,943 and \$1,307 fringe benefits) are required in order to accept this grant. Two contract employees who have the necessary language skills and work experience were hired to assist with these services. The General Fund impact will be \$15,800 for overhead costs as Federal grant guidelines do not provide for any reimbursement. No additional funds are being requested as the regular position is included in the 2010-11 Adopted Budget.

#### 11. Recommendations

That the Council, subject to the approval of the Mayor:

- 1. Authorize the City Attorney or his designee to approve the grant award of \$125,000 for the Underserved Victim Advocacy and Outreach award for the period of October 1, 2010 to September 30, 2011, subject to City Attorney approval as to form and legality;
- 2. Authorize the City Attorney to accept and execute the grant in the amount of \$125,000 between the City and Cal EMA:
- Authorize the Controller to establish a receivable within Fund 368 in the amount of \$125,000 from the Cal EMA
  - a. Establish new appropriation accounts within Fund 368 and appropriate as follows:

Account G401 - Personal Services

Account G403 - Operating Expenses

Account G404 - Contractual Services

- 4. Transfer \$38,637 from Fund 368, Department 12, Account G631 to Fund 100, Department 12, Account 1020 Salaries Grant Reimbursed; and upon receipt of grant funds, transfer \$15,008 from Fund 368, Department 12, Account G401 to Fund 100, Department 12, Account 4610 Reimbursement from other funds/departments for fringe benefits;
- 5. Request the City Attorney to submit invoices to the Cal EMA on a timely basis to ensure that expenditures are reimbursed in a timely manner;
- Authorize the City Attorney or designee to prepare Controller's instructions for any necessary technical adjustments, subject the approval of the City Administrative Officer, and authorize the Controller to implement the instructions; and
- 7. Instruct the City Clerk to place on the Council Calendar on July 1, 2011, the following action relative to the City Attorney's Underserved Victim Advocacy and Outreach program: "That the City Council, subject to the approval of the Mayor, authorize Controller to transfer \$12,789 from Fund 368, Department 12, Account G401-Personal Services to the City Attorney, Dept 12, Fund 100, Account 1020 - Salaries Grant Reimbursed."



The total cost of the 2010-11 Underserved Victim Advocacy and Outreach Grant Program is \$172,050 of which \$125,000 will be fully reimbursed by Cal EMA for salaries, expenses, and fringe benefits. The General Fund impact will be \$15,800 which is City overhead not eligible for reimbursement under Federal grant restrictions. A match of \$31,250 or twenty percent is required for this grant. The acceptance and use of the grant is consistent with the City's Financial Policies in that all eligible program costs are fully funded for the duration of the grant term.

The Office of the City Attorney is transmitting for your review and approval the FY 2010-11 Underserved Victim Advocacy and Outreach (UVAO) grant award in the amount of \$125,000. UVAO replaced the Special Emphasis Grant (SEVAP), which has been discontinued. Following a competitive process, CalEMA informally notified the City Attorney's Office on November 3, 2010 that its application was awarded. The funds originate from the Victim of Crime Act and will pass through CalEMA. Continuation funding is anticipated over the next five years contigent upon satisfactory program performance and availability of funds.

The UVAO funds will provide salaries for one full-time Korean victim advocate and two contractual Korean victim advocates (one full-time and one part-time), which will enable the provision of comprehensive services to victims and witnesses of crime in the underserved Korean-American community. During 2008, the Los Angeles Police Department (LAPD) reported the occurrence of 13,354 robberies, 11,993 aggravated assault and 381homicides. Approximately 13% of these reported cases encompassed the city's Korean-American community. Although a few community groups are available to provide various services to residents in the Korean community, only the Office of the City Attorney's UVAO program will provide comprehensive services specifically for victims of crime in the Korean-American community.

During Fiscal Year 2007-08, advocates provided comprehensive services to 1,043 new Korean-American victims and survivors of crime, 912 crisis counseling and emergency assistance referrals, and 948 resource referrals to other community agencies for additional assistance.

The objective of UVAO is to provide mandated services to surviving family members of homicide victims, victims of robbery/assaults, drunk driving, hit and run, hate crimes, domestic violence, adult sexual assault, child abuse, and elder abuse in the Korean-American community of Los Angeles. The goal is to assist victims to recover from the psychological, emotional and out-of-pocket financial losses incurred due to the injuries suffered as a direct result of the crime and to increase victims' active participation and involvement in the criminal justice system. Within twenty-four hours of any crisis referral to UVAO staff, contact is made with the victims to assess their needs for services and arrange for the provision of these services by local agencies. UVAO maintains an emergency allocation fund (maximum \$100 per incident) and provides victims with direct emergency assistance related to food, clothing, lodging, or transportation. Additionally, UVAO staff refers clients to network agencies that provide services appropriate to the special needs of victims in the Korean-American community. UVAO staff will provide counseling services and, when necessary, agency referrals for group treatment/support. Telephone counseling is also provided when appropriate, with a minimum of 50% of the follow-up contacts conducted through field visits. UVAO staff also provides victims with both verbal and printed information about the procedures and functioning of the criminal justice system.

We, therefore, request that the City Council, subject to the approval of the Mayor:

- APPROVE the Underserved Victim Advocacy and Outreach award and authorize the City Attorney or his designee to execute the contract between the City and CalEMA for the period of October 1, 2010 to September 30, 2011, subject to City Attorney review and approval as to form and legality.
- 2. ACCEPT reimbursement funding in the amount of \$125,000 during the term of the agreement between the City and CalEMA.
- AUTHORIZE the Controller to:
  - A. Establish a receivable in the amount of \$125,000 within Fund 368, Department 12.
  - B. Establish new Appropriation Accounts within Fund 368, Department 12 as follows:

G401 – Personal Services \$66,524
 G403 – Operating Expenses 5,676
 G404 – Contractual Services 52,500

C. Transfer \$38,637 from Fund 368, Department 12, Account G401 - Personal Services to Fund 100, Department 12, Account 1020 Salaries Grant Reimbursed.

- 4. **AUTHORIZE** the City Administrative Officer or his designee to approve the Certification of Assurance of Compliance.
- 5. **AUTHORIZE** the City Attorney or his designee to prepare Controller instructions for any necessary technical adjustments, subject to the approval of the City Administrative Officer, and instruct the Controller to implement the instructions.
- 6. **INSTRUCT** the City Clerk to place on the Council Calendar on July 1, 2011, the following action relative to the City Attorney's UVAO program:

"That the City Council, subject to the approval of the Mayor, authorize the Controller to transfer \$12,879 from Fund 368, Department 12, Account G401 - Personal Services to the City Attorney, Department 12, Fund 100, Account #1020, Salaries, grant reimbursed."
