Dear Hon. Councilmember Krekorian:

People In Progress has been a state licensed provider to the homeless and indigent populations of the City of Los Angeles for 37 years, as well as a contract provider and a grant recipient from the City.

I am writing to urge you to schedule a joint committee meeting for the Community Care Facilities (CCF) proposed ordinance. The draft is pending in the Planning & Land Use Management Committee. The ordinance would impact housing issues as much, if not more than, planning and land use.

Several concerns have already been raised by the Los Angeles Housing Dept. about possible problems with the proposed CCF ordinance including potential conflicts with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA), the Fair Housing Act (FHA) **and its potential threat to HUD funded projects in Los Angeles (including CBDG)** if challenges to the ordinance show either direct or disparate discrimination against protected and/or disabled classes.

We feel this warrants the attention of a joint committee to review the potential housing concerns that fall under the jurisdiction of the Housing, Community and Economic Development Committee.
