APPROVAL OF AMENDED AND RESTATED LEASE AND LICENSE

AGREEMENT WITH ALASKA AIRLINES FOR TERMINAL 6 SPACE AND

IMPROVEMENTS AT THE LOS ANGELES INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT

RECOMMENDATIONS

That the Mayor:

- 1. Approve the proposed Amended and Restated Lease and License Agreement LAA-8581 between the Los Angeles World Airports and Alaska Air Group, Inc. for the consolidation of space in Terminal 6 at the Los Angeles International Airport and extension of the current 10-year lease by six years (for a total of approximately 16 years) to January 1, 2028, to allow the airline to make improvements to the terminal and earn additional Preferential-Use Gates and Preferential Flights subject to Alaska Airlines' compliance with the City's Standard Provisions for Contracting, including the Living Wage/Worker Retention Ordinance, Affirmative Action Program, Contractor Responsibility Program, Child Support Obligations Ordinance, Equal Benefits Ordinance, First Source Hiring Program for all non-trade airport jobs, and the Bidder Contributions CEC (City Ethics Commission) Form 55 provisions, and City Attorney approval as to form;
- 2. Authorize the Chief Executive Officer to execute the Amended and Restated Lease and License Agreement; and,
- 3. Return the Lease and License Agreement to the Department for further processing, including Council consideration.

SUMMARY

The Chief Executive Officer of the Los Angeles World Airports (LAWA; Department) requests approval to execute an Amended and Restated Lease and License Agreement (LAA-8581) with Alaska Air Group, Inc. (Alaska Airlines) for 102,675 square feet of space in Terminal 6 at the Los

Angeles International Airport (LAX). The amendment will modify the space rental rates and extend the current 10-year lease agreement by approximately six years (from March 31, 2022 to January 1, 2028) to allow Alaska Airlines to make improvements to and upgrade the terminal's security screening, layout, boarding gates and boarding bridges, holdrooms, lounge access, and an aircraft parking apron. The proposed term extension will generate approximately \$23,000,000 in revenue during the first year of the lease and approximately \$196,000,000 over the six-year term.

The proposed amendment will increase Alaska Airlines' current space by 35,265 square feet by consolidating space formerly leased by Virgin America Airlines (which was, as the result of a July 2018 merger, fully integrated into Alaska Airlines). Under the proposed amendment, the persquare-foot space rental for Alaska Airlines will increase by \$19.43 (from \$171.40 to \$190.83); there will also be an option for the airline to earn additional Preferential-Use Gates and Preferential Flights by (1) meeting gate utilization standards (e.g., seats-per-gate-per-day), (2) completing the gates reconfiguration and construction of two additional gates to service the new preferential flights within three years of project approval by the Board of Airport Commissioners (Board), and (3) exceeding the average use of all airline Preferential-Use Gates at LAX by 25 percent. Likewise, the option to receive the full six-year lease term is contingent upon Alaska Airlines submitting a Defined Terminal Improvement Program for various terminal improvements beyond those discussed above.

All proposed improvements to the Terminal 6 space are subject to the California Environmental Quality Act and National Environmental Policy Act environmental reviews. The Department may, upon approval by the Board, acquire all improvements from Alaska Airlines at a date to be determined.

The Amended and Restated Lease and License Agreement with Alaska Air Group, Inc. was approved by the Board at its meeting of May 2, 2019. To become effective, the Amended and Restated Lease and License Agreement must be approved by the Council and by the City Attorney as to form.

FISCAL IMPACT STATEMENT

Approval of the Amended and Restated Lease and License Agreement with Alaska Air Group, Inc. (Alaska Airlines) to modify the space rental rates at the Los Angeles International Airport's Terminal 6 and extend the current 10-year lease by approximately six years to allow Alaska Airlines to make improvements to and upgrade the terminal's security screening, hold rooms, and layout will result in approximately \$23,000,000 in rental revenue being generated for the Los Angeles World Airports during the first year and approximately \$196,000,000 over the six-year term. This project complies with the Los Angeles World Airport's adopted Financial Policies. Approval of the Amended Lease and License Agreement will have no impact on the City's General Fund.
