## SUMMARY

The Los Angeles Police Department (LAPD) is seeking approval to accept a \$13,615 grant award for the 2012 Off-Highway Motor Vehicle Recreation (OHMVR) Grant Program from the State of California, Department of Parks and Recreation (DPR) to be used during the period of July 1, 2012 through June 30, 2013 for the purchase of a utility trailer to transport off-road motorcycles throughout the City.

The objective of the OHMVR Program is to ensure the proper usage of off-highway motor vehicles (OHVs) in recreational areas within City limits and to prevent and discourage illegal off-highway vehicle activity throughout the City. The LAPD Off-Road Enforcement Unit (ORU), comprised of three sergeants, 12 officers and one reserve officer, provides directed patrol and enforcement in mountain, forest and other areas not accessible by normal patrol vehicles and in areas where increasing complaints of illegal off-road vehicle activity have been reported. The ORU works in conjunction with the Los Angeles Fire Department (LAFD), the United States Department of Forestry (USDF) and the Los Angeles Department of Water and Power (LADWP) and deploys its resources throughout the week, weekends, holidays and during the heightened fire season or as complaints arise. The ORU, which has patrol responsibility for 469 square miles of land and 165 square miles of fire roads, also works with LAFD on search and rescue efforts and "lost" calls for service.

On March 1, 2012, The LAPD submitted an online application to the DPR requesting \$135,750 in 2012 OHMVR funds to help finance overtime for the ORU, replace off-road motorcycles, and purchase a trailer and safety equipment. The grant application period was less than 61 days, so Mayor and Council approval was not required prior to LAPD submitting the grant application (Los Angeles Administrative Code Section 14.6[b]). On July 23, 2012, the grantor awarded the LAPD \$13,615 in grant funds. Based on the reduced funding awarded, the LAPD has revised its purpose for the OHMVR funds and will use the funds only to purchase a 22-foot utility trailer. This trailer will be used to transport off-road motorcycles within the ORU fleet throughout the City. The Department also received grant funding during the 2011 OHMVR Grant Program, which it used to replace one off-road motorcycle and to purchase safety, navigation and replacement parts equipment (C.F. 11-0929). The LAPD's proposed use of this grant award falls within the eligibility requirements of OHMVR

Program law enforcement grant recipients, which include law enforcement patrol, OHV training, purchase of equipment for OHMVR law enforcement, and purchase and installation of signs and other means of traffic control. The grant also requires a 25 percent in-kind match (\$3,403), which will be met through a portion of the salary of one Police Sergeant position within the ORU that is funded by the OHV Trust Fund. Funding for this position is budgeted in the LAPD 2012-13 Budget and will not have any General Fund impact.

Further details of the grant are provided in the attached correspondence from the Board of Police Commissioners dated August 21, 2012.

## RECOMMENDATIONS

That the Council, subject to the approval of the Mayor:

- 1. Authorize the Chief of Police or his designee to accept the 2012 Off-Highway Motor Vehicle Recreation Grant in the amount of \$13,615 from the State of California, Department of Parks and Recreation for the period of July 1, 2012 through June 30, 2013;
- Authorize the Chief of Police or his designee to negotiate and execute the 2012 Off-Highway
  Motor Vehicle Recreation Grant Program Cooperative Agreement on behalf of the City and
  submit any necessary documents relative to the grant, subject to the approval of the City
  Attorney as to form;
- 3. Authorize the Los Angeles Police Department (LAPD) to submit grant reimbursement requests to the grantor and deposit grant receipts in the Police Department Grant Trust Fund No. 339/70;
- 4. Authorize the Controller to set up a grant receivable in the amount of \$13,615 and establish an appropriation account, account number to be determined, within Fund No. 339/70 for the receipt and disbursement of OHMVR grant funds;
- 5. Authorize the LAPD to spend up to the total grant amount of \$13,615 in accordance with the grant award agreement; and,
- Authorize the LAPD to prepare Controller's instructions for any technical adjustments, subject
  to the approval of the City Administrative Officer, and authorize and instruct the Controller to
  implement the instructions.

## FISCAL IMPACT STATEMENT

The 2012 Off-Highway Motor Vehicle Recreation Grant Program costs are fully reimbursable. The grant requires a 25 percent in-kind match which is provided in the form of a portion of an existing, authorized Police Sergeant salary. The cost of this position's salary is included in the 2012-13 Adopted Budget. There is no impact to the General Fund. The recommendations in this report comply with the City's Financial Policies in that one-time revenue is used for a one-time expense.



F. AUTHORIZE the LAPD to prepare Controller Instructions for any technical adjustments, subject to the approval of the CAO, and AUTHORIZE and INSTRUCT the Controller to implement the instructions.

### DISCUSSION

The OHMVR law enforcement project provides financial assistance to local and federal agencies for protection of life and property, including natural and cultural resources related to OHMVR and motorized access to non-motorized recreation.

The LAPD has a highly specialized Off-Road Enforcement Team that enforces the illegal off-highway vehicle activity throughout the entire City of Los Angeles. The Off-Road Unit at Valley Traffic Division consists of two sergeants and eight officers and works in partnership with the Los Angeles Fire Department for search and rescue efforts, public notification and enforcement on Red Flag days. In addition, joint operations will be conducted with the United States Department of Forestry inside the boundaries of the Angeles National Forest to prevent illegal Off-Highway Vehicle (OHV) activities and resource damage.

The OHMVR Program receives no support from the State's general fund; all funding comes from the OHV Trust Fund. Monics deposited into the OHV Trust Fund are generated by user fees associated with OHV recreation, including: 1) Fuel taxes from gasoline consumed during off-highway recreation on public lands; 2) OHV registration fees; and 3) Entrance fees generated at the State Vehicular Recreation Areas.

The LAPD will utilize the entire grant award for the purchase of a 22-foot utility trailer which will be used to transport the off-road motorcycles throughout the City. The grant award requires a 25% in-kind match. The LAPD will satisfy the match utilizing a percentage of the salary for a Police Sergeant and a Police Officer.

#### **TIEM 1. Proposed Project**

The City of Los Angeles has a highly specialized Off Read Unit (ORU) thei enforces the illegal Off Highway Vehicle (OHV) activity along with any other crimes that may occur within the mountains which encompass the City of Los Angeles (469,3 square miles). These mountain fire reads and trails throughout the City of Los Angeles may not be accessible to normal patrol vehicles, but are reads easily accessible by dual-purpose motorcycles. The ORU currently consists of three motor sergeants, twelve motor officers and one reserve motor officer. All the officers assigned to the ORU are certified through Potice Officer Standards Training (POST). The Los Angeles Police Department has established its own POST certified Dual Purpose Motorcycle Riding School starting in April 2012.

The ORU is currently funded by the City of Los Angeles. The OHV enforcement operations are conducted on a regular basis; throughout the week, weekends and holidays or as complaints arise. With the ever increasing budget restreints on the City of Los Angeles, it has proven challenging for the unit to continue to operate and enforce illegal ORV violations. This Grant would assist the unit to continue its enforcement efforts, provide education for the OHV enthuslasts and the public on legal riding areas related to OHV activity.

With the assistance of last year's OHV grant the ORU was able to purchase two dual purpose motorcycles, but have four motorcycles (KLX 400's) left in the fleet that are reaching their final stages of serviceability. With the current outget crisis that the City of Los Angeles is facing we are having difficulty funding the replacement of these motorcycles. With the assistance of this grant we will be able to purchase new motorcycles and continue to replace our older exhausted fleet.

The ORU is responsible to enforce violations of the Catifornia Penal Codes, Catifornia Vehicle Codes, California Health and Safety Codes, and the Los Angeles Municipal Codes. The ORU also works in partnership with the Los Angeles Fire Department for search and rescue efforts, for public notification and enforcement on Red Flag days.

In addition, joint operations will be conducted with the United States Department of Forestry (USDF) inside the boundaries of the Angeles National Forest to prevent illegal OHV activity and resource damage. We are also working in partnership with the Los Angeles Department of Water and Power (LADWP) to conduct enforcement surrounding the power lines, lowers and waterways that traverse on Los Angeles City property. These water and power ways are vital resources for the City of Los Angeles and are of great concern for Homeland Security. We are in the process (pending) of establishing a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) with LADWP in an effort to protect these vital resources. LADWP has property that traverses through legal riding areas such as Red Rock Canyon, Jawhone, and Dove Springs. On finalization of this MOA we will provide enforcement and protection of these resources upon LADWP written request.

The mountainous tomain bordering the City of Los Angeles has a great deal of protected open space where OHV's are prohibited. The City of Los Angeles has a constant problem with the "garage riders" trespessing on private lands in order to get to these open spaces. Weekly enforcement is a necessity to combat this ongoing problem. Most recently with all the wild fires that have enguited the State of California and the mountains that fall within the City of Los Angeles we have made this a high priority. OHV vehicles have the potential to start fires from lack of spark arrestors.

The ORU also participates in various community gatherings' such as, fairs and car shows sponsored by the department throughout the entire City of Los Angeles. At these events, we distribute educational materials to enhance community awareness and public safety with regard to the operation of OHV. At these events we also direct the public on legal locations to safety enjoy OHV activity.

#### ITEM 2, Project Coverage

The area patrolled by the Los Angeles Police Department ORU is unique, there are many mountains that surround the city and engoing development of new construction continues on the surrounding borders. Unfortunately, these areas are

restricted zones and designated as a high fire danger zones or land that are privately owned or closed public lands. Therefore, the vehicles traspassing on private and public lands remain a constant problem and source of hundreds of citizen complaints. The lectain that surrounds the city is attractive to OHV enthusiasts, and therefore a large number of "garage riders" exist. These "garage riders" litegally ride their OHV's from their homes, down city streets and onto private and public lands, which are closed to motor vehicles. The ORM patrols these areas and routinely responds to "Search and Rescue" and "Lost" calls for service in the mountainous areas.

The Los Angeles Police Department, ORU is responsible for 469.3 square miles of land and 165 square miles of fire roads within our city limits. As also indicated we are in the process of establishing a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) with LADWP in an effort to protect the water and power right of ways. LADWP has properly that traverses through legal riding areas such as Red Rock Canyon, Jawbone, and Oove Springs. On finalization of this MOA we will be able to provide enforcement and protection of these vital resources upon LADWP property.

The ORU responds to numerous citizen complaints for those entire areas and conducts routine patrols on all fire roads, traits, private land and State Parks that are within the city limits.

#### ITEM 3. Describe the frequency of the patrols

The Los Angeles Police Department ORU will continue to provide OHV enforcement patrols during the week, weekends and some holidays year round. Once the Memorandum of Agreement between LADWP and the Los Angeles Police Department ORU is established we will deploy upon written request to areas outside the city limits, but within Los Angeles City property. The region within the city is seldom impacted by inclement weather; therefore, OHV patrols are needed year round. Enforcement operations will typically be conducted four times a month during daylight hours; however, the hours and days of the week will very slightly so as not to develop a pattern allowing the violators to circumvent our presence. In addition to the dedicated OHV patrol operations, our regular officers will continue to enforce OHV violations when they are able to safely make contact with OHV violators.

## ITEM 4. Deployment of Personnel

The Los Angeles Police Department ORU presently has three sergeants, twelve officers and one reserve officer assigned to the unit. The unit has six dual purpose molocycles, one Ford pick-up truck (4x4), one Ford Explorer (4x4) and a helicopter for support that is available to respond to the ORU on request.

On a typical ten-hour day (OHV enforcement shift), The ORU deploys one sergeant, five officers on dual-purpose motorcycles, and one officer driving a 4x4 vehicle. On each operation, the motorcycles will traverse approximately 80-120 miles of fire roads trails, and other areas frequented by off-road enthusiasts.
