NEGATIVE DECLARATION, PLANNING AND LAND USE MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE REPORT and ORDINANCE relative to amending the Los Angeles Municipal Code (LAMC) to require on-site shopping cart containment systems for new retail establishments and major remodels that provide six or more shopping carts for use by patrons.

Recommendations for Council action, SUBJECT TO THE APPROVAL OF THE MAYOR:

- 1. FIND that this project will not have a significant effect on the environment, pursuant to the City's Environmental Guidelines and is in compliance with the California Environmental Quality Act; that the Negative Declaration reflects the independent judgment of the City of Los Angeles; that the documents constituting the record of proceedings in this matter are located in Council File No.11-1141 in the custody of the City Clerk and in the files of the Department of City Planning in the custody of the Environmental Review Section; and ADOPT the Negative Declaration [ENV-2010-1074-ND].
- 2. ADOPT the FINDINGS of the Los Angeles City Planning Commission, including the Environmental Findings, as the Findings of the Council.
- 3. PRESENT and ADOPT the accompanying ORDINANCE, amending LAMC Subsection F of Section 12.21 to require on-site shopping cart containment systems for new retail establishments and major remodels that provide six or more shopping carts for use by patrons.

<u>Fiscal Impact Statement</u>: None submitted by the Planning Department and City Attorney. Neither the City Administrative Officer nor the Chief Legislative Analyst has completed a financial analysis of this report.

Summary:

At the public hearing held on April 24, 2012, the Planning and Land Use Management Committee considered City Attorney and Planning Department reports and Ordinance relative to amending LAMC Subsection F of Section 12.21 to require on-site shopping cart containment systems for new retail establishments and major remodels that provide six or more shopping carts for use by patrons. A representative from the department gave the Committee background information on the matter.
