reports as follows:

PLANNING AND LAND USE MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE REPORT relative to a proposed ordinance amending the Los Angeles Municipal Code (LAMC) with development regulations that require on-site shopping cart containment systems for new stores and major remodels that provide six or more shopping carts for use to its patrons.

Recommendations for Council action:

- 1. FIND that this project will not have a significant effect on the environment, pursuant to the City's Environmental Guidelines and is in compliance with the California Environmental Quality Act; that the Negative Declaration reflects the independent judgment of the City of Los Angeles; that the documents constituting the record of proceedings in this matter are located in Council File No. 11-1141 in the custody of the City Clerk and in the files of the Department of City Planning in the custody of the Environmental Review Section; and ADOPT the Negative Declaration [ENV 2010-1074-ND].
- 2. ADOPT the FINDINGS of the City Planning Commission (CPC) as the Findings of the Council.
- 3. REQUEST the City Attorney to prepare and present an ordinance amending Section 12.21 F of the LAMC with development regulations that require on-site shopping cart containment systems for new stores and major remodels that provide six or more shopping carts for use to its patrons.

<u>Fiscal Impact Statement</u>: None submitted by the Planning Department. Neither the City Administrative Officer nor the Chief Legislative Analyst has completed a financial analysis of this report.

Community Impact Statement: None submitted.

Summary:

At the public hearing held on July 12, 2011, the Planning and Land Use Management (PLUM) Committee considered a CPC report and proposed ordinance relative to amending Section 12.21 F of the Los Angeles Municipal Code with development regulations that require on-site shopping cart containment systems for new stores and major remodels that provide six or more shopping carts for use to its patrons. During the discussion of this matter, an overview of the proposed ordinance was provided by Planning Department staff and testimony was heard from the public. After an opportunity for public comment, the PLUM Committee recommended that Council request the City Attorney to prepare the final ordinance as recommended by the CPC.
