INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY AND GENERAL SERVICES COMMITTEE REPORT and RESOLUTION relative to the naming of City Hall East as James K. Hahn City Hall East.

Recommendation for Council action, pursuant to Resolution (Hahn - Garcetti - et. al.):

ADOPT the accompanying RESOLUTION recognizing James K. Hahn's leadership and service to the City by naming City Hall East (200 North Main Street) as James K. Hahn City Hall East.

Fiscal Impact Statement: Neither the City Administrative Officer nor the Chief Legislative Analyst has completed a financial analysis of this report.

Community Impact Statement: None submitted.

Summary:

On January 17, 2012, your Committee considered Resolution (Hahn - Garcetti - et. al.) relative to the naming of City Hall East as James K. Hahn City Hall East. The Resolution, attached to the Council file, provides background information on this subject. During the discussion of this item, Councilmembers Alarcón and Cárdenas, as well as various speakers present at the meeting, spoke highly of James K. Hahn's leadership and accomplishments and expressed their support of the Resolution. The Committee then proceeded to recommend that Council adopt the Resolution, as reflected above. WHEREAS, Mayor James K. Hahn was elected in 2001, and was able to keep the City of Los Angeles united by preventing various succession efforts, and under whose leadership the rising crime rate was turned around and enhanced the quality of life in our neighborhoods; and

WHEREAS, Mayor Hahn's aggressive efforts to put more police officers on the street led to the first increase in LAPD officers in four years; and

WHEREAS, Mayor Hahn recruited business leaders to help fund the expansion of the city's nationally-recognized LA's BEST program to serve an additional 5,500 kids at more than 45 additional schools, expanding the program to serve 20,000 students at over 120 schools with a safe, educational, and fun place to go during the crucial after school hours; and

WHEREAS, Mayor Hahn was the first mayor to initiate major efforts to clean up our air and water, setting an ambitious goal for the city's Department of Water and Power to increase its use of clean energy sources, as well as creating the "No Net Increase" task force, requiring that the Port of Los Angeles curb its air emissions; and

WHEREAS, Mayor Hahn was the first mayor to work with the new neighborhood councils, working with them to identify their neighborhood priorities, he developed city budgets that funded record levels of street improvements, and provided each neighborhood council with up to \$50,000 per year to pay for operating expenses and local projects of their choice; and

WHEREAS, Mayor Hahn was a leader in affordable housing, bringing together developers and housing advocates to create a \$100 million Housing Trust Fund, the largest of its kind in the nation; and

WHEREAS, Jim Hahn was raised in the Crenshaw neighborhood of South Los Angeles, and attended Manchester Avenue Elementary School, Daniel Freeman Elementary School, Horace Mann Junior High School, and Lutheran High School. He received a B.A. in English at Pepperdine University. During this time, he served as a student volunteer helping abused women get restraining orders. His experience encouraged him to pursue his law degree, which he also received from Pepperdine; and






WHEREAS, before he was Mayor, Jim Hahn served Los Angeles for 16 years as City Attorney (1985-2001) and four years as City Controller (1981-1985), spending all that time within the walls of the City Hall East building; and

WHEREAS, because of his distinguished achievements and service James K. Hahn is one of the great leaders in the history of Los Angeles;
