Although Mr. Keene is attempting to run away from the facts in his own study, there are several points that are inescapable. A reusable bag can carry the norovirus or any other infectious agent. In the study the new cases were in a nearby hotel room. It could just as easily have been carried to any other location, including a grocery store where hundreds could have been infected. A bagger at the grocery store, after handling a customer's infected reusable bag, would then have the infection on his hands and would then be able to transfer it to the reusable bag and the purchases of another customer and to every other item that he handled in the store. This is the common result that is cause of wide-spread norovisus outbrakes on cruise ships. A grocery store would be held liable for any damages from this action. Please note the long litany of precautions and alternative scenarios Mr Keene recites that would have been required to avoid the infectious outbreak in the Oregon study. There is no quarantee that a reusable bag would always be washed or sanitized before every reuse or that everyone has multiple bathrooms to isolate infected individuals or that the bag was not in contact with an infected person.
