ZOO DEPARTMENT REPORT BACK REGARDING VEGAN

PROTEIN OPTIONS (C.F. NO. 11-1678-S3)

SUMMARY

On October 29, 2019, the City Council instructed the Zoo Department to report back on the vegan protein entrée options available at City concessionaire locations and ways to ensure that these options are available on an ongoing basis (C.F. 11-1678-S3). This report includes a summary of all of the Zoo's current vegan menu options, comparisons with vegan menu options at other local venues, and plans for additional offerings that will enhance the vegan menu options at the Zoo.

ZOO CONCESSIONS PROGRAM

The Zoo's concessions program is managed through an Operating Agreement between the City and the Greater Los Angeles Zoo Association (GLAZA) (C.F. 14-0600-S223). A new concessions contract between GLAZA and Service Systems Associates Group, LLC (SSA) began in August 2019, as the result of a comprehensive request for proposals process approved by the City. GLAZA's contract with SSA includes compliance with the City's Good Food Purchasing Policy and a commitment to providing food options that are healthy, fair, and sustainable.

Current Concessions Offering

The Zoo has a total of 14 distinct food concessions locations which include six full-service concessions food stands and eight snack stands located throughout the Zoo facility offering a variety of entrées and snacks. Three of the six full-service locations include vegan protein entrée options; and all but one of the total locations (including eateries and snack stands) have vegan snack options.



Zoo food concessions provide 49 distinctive offerings that includes 15 different vegan items. These vegan offerings include fresh salads, and four vegan protein options of black bean, mushroom or Beyond brand meatless burgers, as well as a child's sunflower butter and jelly sandwich. The vegan options represent approximately 31% of the available food item offerings. Additionally, there is no increased pricing for vegan options.

A copy of the Zoo map which lists the Zoo's food stands and locations with vegan entrée offerings identified by the vegan symbol, \mathfrak{V} , is provided as an attachment to this report (Attachment A).

Comparisons with Other Local Venues

The Zoo's concessionaire maintains a commitment to maximizing its healthy and vegan food options at the Zoo and as a leader in the regional market. A vegan menu options comparison was conducted by SSA though onsite visitation at four local venues. The results are shown in the table below and demonstrates how the Zoo compares favorably with these local venues.

Future Plans

As part of the new concessions contract, SSA is committed to making significant capital improvements to the concessions facilities throughout the Zoo. These improvements will enable the Zoo to enhance and increase the vegan offerings which includes increasing the number of fresh, locally sourced ingredients and expanding options for both children and adults. One example of this will be to partner with the Bean Sprouts company, a woman-owned company recognized as an innovator in delivering healthy food options that cater to families with special dietary choices and challenges including vegetarian and vegan, gluten-free, dairy-free, casein-free, nut-free, egg-free, and soy-free offerings. Below is an example of what this offering may resemble.

The concessions program is an integral component of the Zoo's commitment to expanding and developing innovative ways to reach and include the diverse community that we serve in all of our offerings from food to programming. The Zoo concessions program and its new concepts seeks to engage our visitors and embody our mission with an emphasis on conservation and sustainability.

FISCAL IMPACT STATEMENT

The costs associated with the continuation and expansion of the Zoo's vegan dining options are included as part of the new concessions contract. As a result, there would be no impact to the General Fund.
