Subject: AUTHORITY TO ACCEPT \$125,000 OF GRANT FUNDING FROM THE SOUTH COAST AIR QUALITY MANAGEMENT DISTRICT UNDER THE PROPOSITION 1B: GOODS MOVEMENT EMISSION REDUCTION PROGRAM IN SUPPORT OF THE LA SANITATION CLEAN FUEL PROGRAM FOR SOLID RESOURCES COLLECTION VEHICLES

As recommended in the accompanying report of the Director of the Bureau of Sanitation, which this Board has adopted, the Board of Public Works requests that the City Council, subject to concurrence of the Mayor, authorize the Director of the Bureau of Sanitation, or his designee to accept \$125,000 in grant funds from the South Coast Air Quality Management District (SCAQMD), to conduct all negotiations, including but not limited to, agreements, amendments, subject to the approval of the City Attorney as to form and legality, which may be necessary to secure funding with respect to the purchase of 5 new heavy-duty natural gas powered Solid Resources Collection Vehicles (SRCV). This is an amendment of contract No. 12884 to provide an additional \$125,000 award to replace an additional 5 old diesel SRCV with new natural gas powered SRCV. Authority to apply for grant funding was approved on October 26, 2011, by the City Council per Council File No. 11-1703 (Transmittal No. 1).

It is also requested, that the City Council, subject to the concurrence of the Mayor, adopt the Resolution (Transmittal No. 3) approving the acceptance of grant funding in the amount of \$125,000 and appointing the Director of the Bureau of Sanitation, or his designee to conduct all negotiations and to execute and submit all documents necessary to accept and expend grant funding for the purchase of 5 heavy-duty natural gas powered SRCV.

FISCAL IMPACT

There is no impact to the General Fund. The receipt of grant funds will enable the City of Los Angeles to reduce the cost of purchasing 5 new heavy-duty natural gas powered SRCV from the Solid Waste Resources Revenue Bond, Series 2013-A. Failure to accept the grant award of \$125,000 from the SCAQMD will eliminate available funding to the City of Los Angeles to help offset the purchase cost of new SRCV.
