Ordinance Background

Year	Action
2008	Council requested revision of sign provisions
2009	CPC approved draft ordinance
2014	PLUM requested 7 changes and 8 clarifications

Ordinance in process 6 years, with over 15 hearings





Proposed Ordinance Overview

- Enables Tier 1 and Tier 2 Sign Districts
- Establishes new Takedown Ratio program
- New digital display regulations (brightness & timing)
- New higher penalties for "illegal" off-site signs

Improves clarity, enforceability, and legality





Why Is This Ordinance Needed Now?

- Comply with court rulings
 - Limited, objective criteria for exceptions
 - Aesthetics and traffic safety
 - Content neutrality (only time, place, manner)
- Preclude further lawsuits and legal costs
- Modernize, streamline and refine the City's sign regulations






Sign Districts: Currently Eligible Areas

Any property in C & M Zones

R5-zoned property designated as Regional Center, Regional Commercial, or High Intensity Center




Areas Eligible for Sign Districts (current)



Sign Districts: Proposed Eligible Areas

- Regional Centers
- LAX
- Port of LA
- Greater downtown area
- Stadiums (≥ 20,000 seats)
- LA Zoo





Proposed Prohibited Areas

- Prohibited near single family zones, LA River, state/national parks, ecological preserves
- This is a 90% reduction in eligible areas





Proposed Sign Reduction Provisions

Off-Site Takedown Ratios


- 1:1 for static
- 2:1 for digital*

Community Benefits

 Half of requirement may be met by community benefits (traffic /aesthetics)

^{*}Requirement increased from the 2009 CPC version per recommendation of the Department





Digital Displays

Timing Requirements

- Minimum per message
- Instant/short transitions

Brightness limits

- 7,500 candelas (day)
- 450 candelas (night)

Sensors for auto dimming



Amnesty for "Illegal" Signs

- State law requires proof of illegality to trigger enforcement provisions; proof requires evidence
- Signs with no permit: 546 total
 - Allow as legal nonconforming
 - No permit likely means no evidence of illegality
- Signs with permit, but not in compliance: 391 total
 - Subject to citation and enforcement
 - Permit can be used as evidence of noncompliance



Additional Considerations* Digital Displays Outside Sign Districts

Visioning Group met 3 times:

- Option 1: "No digital" off-site signs outside of Sign Districts
- Option 2: "Public Option" Digital billboards on public (city-owned) property only
- Option 3: "Public/Private Option" Digital billboards on public and private properties

Additional Considerations* Digital Displays Outside Sign Districts

Potential Provisions:

- CUP for off-site digital display
- Relocation agreement
- Clearly defined standards and conditions
- 4:1 or greater Takedown Ratio
- Community benefits conditions through CUP
- Distance from neighboring sigs and illumination standards
- Citywide cap on digital off-site signs

Process

Version A: if approved, ordinance must return to CPC

 Version B: if approved, ordinance can be transmitted to full Council
