Honorable City Councilmembers:

On behalf of the neighbors in Sunland-Tujunga, I submit the attached letter/petition and signatures urging the closure of Medical Marijuana Dispensaries in our Sunland-Tujunga community.

Currently there are at least a dozen MMD's in S-T within a 2-3 mile stretch of Foothill Blvd. The LAPD tells us S-T has more MMD's than all of Foothill Division (Pacoima, Sylmar, Shadow Hills, S-T and Lake View Terrace.) These shops pose a serious threat to our safety and quality of life. There are MMD's located within 600' of local parks and within 1000' of each other.

The complaints are many from residents and legal business owners, including a negative impact on commerce, safety risks and increased fear of criminal activity by customers congregating near these shops. These shops are in conflict with the goals of the Foothill Blvd. Corridor Specific Plan and it's Design Guidelines (which are both City of L.A. ordinances.)

We urge you to pass the Gentle Ban and enforce Land Use & Public Safety Ordinances. (We would prefer there be no MMD's, but rather the product be controlled by Licensed Pharmacies.) Please support our Law Enforcement Officers by passing this ban instead of continuing the drain on public resources and placing the public at a safety risk.

We support the Huizar/Englander motion.

Re: Petition submitted at the Senior Lead Police Summit

To: Paul Krekorian, LA City Council member, S-T Neighborhood Council members, LA City Attorney Carmen Trutanich, and LAPD Chief Charlie Beck.

Since I am speaking on behalf of nearly 200 neighbors, I ask to be heard as I read the following statement which will take about 3 minutes.

My name is Kathleen Pratt and I've been attending this monthly meeting for over 2 years. I have learned a great deal about our community. I became involved with the Neighborhood Watch program after experiencing a home invasion/burglary.

I now act as our Block Captain and tend to 'hear it all' from concerned neighbors. I do my best to present their concerns in a considerate and fair manner. I really appreciate the support and involvement of the many neighbors who participate in our great watch. And thanks to Officer Larry Martinez, I was fortunate to have participated in the 8 week OVB Community Police Training at the Academy where I met many dedicated Officers and citizens.

Since we're here tonight to discuss current issues in our community, I present the attached petition on behalf of my neighbors, addressed to the following:

S-T Representative Paul Krekorian, members of the S-T Neighborhood Council, LA City Attorney Carmen Trutanich and LAPD Chief Charlie Beck. In just a couple of days, nearly 200 neighbors signed this petition to voice concern over the many Marijuana Dispensaries lining Foothill Blvd.

Several neighbors participated in collecting these signatures. The idea came from a neighbor who spoke up and submitted an article to the local 'Good News' newspaper, however, it was not published. (Perhaps the article did not pass for good news.) The article was fair and asked several questions: Why are there so many dispensaries? How do they get approved for permits? How many of these shops are really needed in our community? The article also commented about the concern for increased criminal activity related to these operations. (We are already finding used containers on our streets. And we've been told which Doctor office in the Valley to visit if we need to get our card.)

Some of the same neighbors attended a recent community meeting to discuss "What's Wrong with Foothill Blvd.?" This question seems easy enough to answer when the only business in town seems to be the opening of Dispensaries. Maybe we should all agree that for every dispensary in town, we should also get a new book store or garden store, or restaurant or market! As one Wyngate Avenue neighbor remarked: "I need a store where I can buy socks!"

The focus of the Foothill Blvd. meeting seemed to get stuck on the Home Depot defeat and several other properties of concern. In a follow up newspaper article about the meeting,

there was no mention of audience questions pertaining to the dispensaries. And even though these same concerns have been expressed over and over at <u>this</u> monthly meeting, one Foothill Officer recently commented that it's the 'first' he's heard of community concerns about the dispensaries.

We hear neighborhood council members complain about the lack of representation from Paul Krekorian's Office, and that he's a "lame duck." Well he's still our duck! So let's hold him accountable to speak up for us! S-T Neighborhood Council members serve in mandated and city funded council positions, so the community holds council members accountable to listen and speak up for our community! When's the last time you got out from your meeting and walked the neighborhoods and knocked on doors? Let's move on from discussing Home Depot and the vacant- lot- eye- sore we're left with.

Neighbors now ask - Just what sort of coordination, if any, is there between our local and City offices? Between the council and police, between Senior Lead Officers and Foothill Supervisors? How are landlords allowed to rent to and open businesses? We hear that merchants are told a new business is to open and then it turns out to be a dispensary? Does anyone follow honest business practice any more - for the good of the community? And speaking from a business perspective — isn't the marijuana market totally saturated? So why do the so-called caregivers want to have Foothill Blvd. lined with dispensaries? Isn't it better to be the only choice in town? Then again, maybe the thought is there's a huge market here since our neighbors in Glendale and Burbank outlaw these shops.

We do not debate the medical need for such a product. Some of us actually support it! However, we might add that less than a handful of neighbors commented on loved ones who actually use medical marijuana. (Just how many sick people are there in S-T?)

We do not debate the current mess of City, State and Federal politics surrounding the issue. The police continue asking for our support and they have it! We are doing our part! However, without a Senior Lead Officer for S-T (also a mandated position), our community, as another neighbor put it, "continues to get the short end of the stick."

We are tired of hearing the excuses about the budget, re-districting, all the petty small town politics and disputes between the local newspapers. We say to Chief Beck and the Mayor; we need a dedicated Senior Lead Officer for Sunland now, not a rotating cop every two months! Find a way, make it happen! Crime happens here too, not just in Glendale and on the west side! Where's our fair share of resources?

Lastly, we end with a quote from our neighbors' unpublished news article: "Help keep this community one that encourages viable business to come to and a place to raise our children without fear."


