SUMMARY

In accordance with Executive Directive No. 3, the Department of Aging (Department) requests authority to execute amendments to increase funding to their service providers for the delivery of Evidence-Based Programs (EBP), with no extension of the term. The proposed agreements are included with this report as Attachment 1. The combined funding for the proposed amendments is \$847,998.

The purpose of the EBP is to provide older adults with programs that enhance wellness skills in a variety of areas, including self-management, healthier living, physical activity, and memory enhancement. The Council approved the Department's request to release a Request for Proposals (RFP) for the selection of Contractors to provide EBP services in November 2015 (C.F. 11-1896). The Council approved the Department's request to execute contracts with the successful bidders in June 2016, subject to the verification of all contract compliance documents (C.F. 11-1896).

Funding in the amount of \$298,447 for the original agreements was provided by the CDBG, 43rd Program Year, as part of the Aging Services Delivery System (C.F. 16-1091). To prevent a reduction in EBP services, additional funding of \$847,998 was provided by the City Council from the General Fund in the 2017-18 Adopted Budget (C.F. 17-0600). The Department requests authority to allocate the additional funds as described in Attachment 2.

In accordance with Charter Section 1022, the Personnel Department determined that City classifications cannot perform the work required for EBP services. To the best of our knowledge, the Contractors have complied with the City's contracting requirements, policies and procedures. The proposed agreement is subject to review by the City Attorney as to form.

Council approval of the proposed amendments is required because Council approved the original agreements.

FISCAL IMPACT

Funds for the proposed amendments are available in Fund 100, Department 2, Account 003040, as provided in the 2017-18 Adopted Budget. There is no additional impact on the General Fund. Approval of this agreement is in compliance with the City's Financial Policies as one-time funding is being used for one-time expenditures.

CONSIDERATION

Per Mayor's Executive Directive 3. the Los Angeles Department of Aging (LADOA) requests Mayor and the City Council's approval to amend the 2017-2018 contracts of Evidence Based Program (EBP) service providers for the purpose of increasing the funding allocation for the delivery of EBP services by \$56,250 from \$18,750 to \$75,000 (Attachment 1). The delivery of Citywide EBP services increases by \$4,248 from \$17,197 to \$21,445. The total increase of contract funding for the EBP programs is \$847,998 from \$298,447 to \$1,146,445.

SUMMARY

In June 2016, approval was granted to the LADOA to contract with service providers for the delivery of EBP services throughout the 15 Aging Service Areas (ASAs) within the City of Los Angeles (CF 11-1896). Service providers were selected through a Request for Proposal process.

The LADOA was approved to contract with the successful service providers for the period beginning April 1, 2016 through March 31, 2017 with an option to extend the contract for up to three additional years in one year increments, at the discretion of the LADOA General Manager, and subject to the review and approval of the City Attorney. The current contract period, beginning on April 1, 2017 through March 31, 2018, is the first year of the three-year option.

Funding for the EBP is in the amount of \$75,000 per ASA. The source of the funding is Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) – Public Service funding and General Fund (GF) dollars.

The 43rd Year of the Consolidated Plan (CF 16-1091) was approved allocating \$298,447 for the delivery of EBP services for a total of \$18,750 per ASA (an additional \$17,197) was awarded to Partners In Care Foundation for the provision of technical assistance city wide). This funding allocation is for the program period April 1, 2017 through March 31, 2018. However, no GCP funding was allocated in the 43rd Year of the Consolidated Plan for this program period.

The 2017-2018 City Budget (CF 17-0600) includes GF funding in the amount of \$847,998 which restores the EBP allocation of \$75,000 in each of the ASAs and the \$21,445 for the delivery of citywide EBP services.

The LADOA seeks approval to amend the contracts of each EBP provider which will increase the contract amounts by \$56,250 from \$18,750 to \$75,000. Funding for the delivery of EBP services, citywide, will increase by \$4,248 from \$17,197 to \$21,445. Total contract funding for the EB program will increase by \$847,998 from \$298,447 to \$1,146,445. General Fund dollars in the amount of \$847,998 for the Evidence Based Programs were approved and allocated to the LADOA with the adoption of the 2017-2018 City Budget.

The LADOA reports that its proposed actions will require the allocation of \$847,998 of General Fund dollars which was included in the 2017-2018 City of Los Angeles City Budget approved by the City Council and Mayor (CF 17-0600) dated May 25, 2017.
