Hello Ms. Gin and the Plum Committee:

I am writing to voice my concern about the Hollywood Community plan in its current state. I have gone to hearings and voiced my issues to what seems like people who have already made up their minds. It is unfair for the city to push a plan on residents when it does not take the feelings, thoughts or concerns of the residents in the community. Yes, there are a lot of businesses here, so what, how many of those business owners actually live here?

As a resident, I can tell you that we are subject to more street closures than anywhere else in the city, whether it's for movie premieres, marathons, peace marches, filming or whatever events the chamber decides to put its stamp of approval on.
