Dear Colleagues:

The importance of the public safety services provided by the Los Angeles Fire Department cannot be overstated. While the commitment and performance of the Department's firefighters is beyond question, the Department's management of response times is currently in dispute.

During last year's budget deliberations I led the Council in rejecting the elimination of 318 firefighter positions and to move \$6.7 million to a new budget line item: "Restoration of Neighborhood Fire Services (C.F. 11–0600). In addition, the deployment plan approved by Council provided Department management with increased numbers of firefighters, paramedics and various equipment. Council expected the Department to use these increased resources to decrease response times.

The people of Los Angeles deserve certainty that the Department's data are accurate, and moreover that they will be well-served during emergencies.

Accordingly, I urge you to support my motion (C.F. 12-0395-S2) for an independent expert analysis so that we can determine actual response times and what those times mean in terms of public safety. And we seek recommendations as to what the Department can do to do better.
