SUBJECT:

Temporary Closure of the Walkway Northeasterly of Sharp Avenue between Brand Boulevard and MacNeil Street. – Council File No. 12-0398

RECOMMENDATIONS:

- A. That the walkway as shown on the attached sketch, subject to the conditions contained herein, be temporarily closed pursuant to State Vehicle Code Section 21101.4 for a period of eighteen (18) months upon Council approval.
- B. That the City Council find that this is categorically exempt under Article III, Class
 5, of the Los Angeles City Guidelines for the implementation of the California
 Environmental Quality Act of 1970.
- C. That the City Council adopt the accompanying Resolution signed by the City Attorney.
- D. That the City Council adopt the following findings:
 - 1. There is substantial evidence of serious and continual criminal activities in the walkway recommended for temporary closure.
 - 2. The temporary closure of the walkway will reduce the criminal activity in the area.
 - 3. The walkway does not provide necessary vehicular or pedestrian access to adjacent properties but affected property owners have agreed to the temporary closure.

- 4. The closure will not substantially adversely affect traffic flow, safety on adjacent streets or in the surrounding neighborhoods, the operation of emergency vehicles, the performance of municipal or public utility services, or the delivery of freight by commercial vehicles in the walkway proposed to be temporarily closed.
- 5. Vehicular and pedestrian traffic on the walkway contributes to the criminal activities.
- 6. The walkway has not been designated as a though highway or arterial street.

FISCAL IMPACT STATEMENT:

The Bureau of Engineering is absorbing the cost of processing the request in the approximate amount of \$5,000.00. Maintenance of the public easement by City forces will be eliminated.

TRANSMITTALS:

- 1. Sketch indicating the area to be temporarily closed.
- 2. Motion from Council District No. 7, dated March 16, 2012.
- 3. Letter from the Police Department, received July 20, 2012.
- 4. Draft of Resolution for Temporary Walkway closure.

CONDITIONS:

- 1. That any gates to be installed to effectuate a physical closure of the walkway area together with the gate locations be approved by the Fire Department, and the Department of Water and Power and the Department of Transportation and the Bureau of Sanitation's Wastewater Collection Systems Division and be done under "B Permit" issued by the City Engineer and be installed at no cost to the City.
- 2. The keys to any gates to be installed be provided to all affected City Departments and Public Utility Companies.
- 3. The routine clean-up of the closed area be provided by the adjoining property owners/residents.
- 4. That the closed area be physically closed within 6 months of Council approval of the temporary closure or the approval be rescinded.
- 5. That the petitioners agree to remove the gates/fences upon termination of the allowed closure period at no cost to the City.

DISCUSSION:

On May 25, 2012, under Council File No. 12-0398 a motion from Council District No. 7 was adopted by the City Council directing the City Engineer to initiate proceedings to close the Walkway northeasterly of Sharp Avenue between Brand Boulevard and MacNeil Street.

Senior Lead Officer Philip Ruiz of Los Angeles Police Department in a letter received July 20, 2012 stated "Part of my duties of handling the citizen complaints is to conduct frequent foot beats in the walkway and monitor the activity. During my foot beats, I have observed piles of trash on the ground, graffiti along the freeway walls, empty beer cans/bottles on the ground, and on a few occasions I have observed discarded drug paraphernalia on the ground of the walkway. Also on one occasion, I had to run off an area transient who had set up an encampment and used the walkway for shelter." Officer Philip Ruiz further stated "While conducting a study of crimes and Police calls for service for the area over the last two years, one of the residences in the area that has been hit the hardest due to the walkway is the residence located at 14607 Brand Blvd. This particular residence is directly adjacent to the walkway with its east side wall of the residence being directly next to the walkway. Because of its close proximity and easy access to and from the walkway, suspects can easily jump onto the property from the walkway and victimize the location. In the last two years, this residence has been the victim of (1) residential burglary, (1) grand theft auto, and (1) theft of outside Air Conditioning parts."

There were two emails received in support of the walkway closure.

Conclusion:

The temporary closure of the Walkway northeasterly of Sharp Avenue between Brand Boulevard and MacNeil Street is feasible subject to the conditions of this report.

RESOLUTION FOR TEMPORARY CLOSURE OF A WALKWAY (California State Vehicle Code Section 21101.4)

The Council of the City of Los Angeles hereby finds and determines that the walkway northeasterly of Sharp Avenue between Brand Boulevard and MacNeil Street should be temporarily closed for a period of 18 months due to serious and continuing criminal activities as determined and recommended by the Police Department; and

That there is substantial evidence of serious and continual criminal activities in the walkway recommended for temporary closure; and

That the temporary closure of the walkway will help reduce the criminal activities; and

That the temporary closure of the walkway will not substantially adversely affect traffic flow, safety on the adjacent streets or in the surrounding neighborhoods, the operation of emergency vehicles and performance of municipal and public utility services and the delivery of freight by commercial vehicles in the area proposed to be temporarily closed; and

That the vehicular or pedestrian traffic in the walkway contributes to the criminal activities; and

That the walkway has not been designated as a through highway or arterial street; and

The Council of the City of Los Angeles hereby finds and determines that the walkway northeasterly of Sharp Avenue between Brand Boulevard and MacNeil Street as shown on attached "Exhibit A" is unnecessary to remain open for pedestrians and vehicular traffic; and

The City Council hereby elects to proceed under the above captioned provision of the said Code Section; and hereby resolves that the said walkway be and the same is temporarily closed; and

The particular portion of the public walkway which is to be temporarily closed is described herein as follows:

The walkway northeasterly of Sharp Avenue between Brand Boulevard and MacNeil Street.

The City Clerk shall certify this resolution and affix the City seal, and shall transmit a sealed copy of this resolution to the City Engineer.

IT IS THEREFORE RESOLVED, that the alley area described hereinabove and shown on attached "Exhibit A" is closed for a maximum period of eighteen (18) months.

Subject: Citizen requests for the closure of "pedestrian walkway" located just west of the Golden State 5 Fwy between Brand Blvd and San Fernando Mission Blvd.

Hello,

My name is Officer Philip Ruiz from the LAPD Mission Station, and I am the Senior Lead Officer for the Mission Hills Area (Basic Car 19A43). My job as a Senior Lead Officer is to reduce crime and improve the "Quality of Life" in the community I serve.

I am writing to you regarding the pedestrian walkway located adjacent to the 5 freeway between Brand Blvd and San Fernando Mission Blvd. Since being assigned as the Senior Lead Officer for the area, I have received numerous citizen complaints about the pedestrian walkway involving quality of life issues. The complaints range from graffiti, to people loitering in the walkway, people drinking alcohol in the walkway, and people doing illegal narcotics in the walkway.

Part of my duties of handling the citizen complaints is to conduct frequent foot beats in the walkway and monitor the activity. During my foot beats, I have observed piles of trash on the ground, graffiti along the freeway walls, empty beer cans/bottles on the ground, and on a few occasions I have observed discarded drug paraphernalia on the ground of the walkway. Also on one occasion, I had to run off an area transient who had set up an encampment and used the walkway for shelter.

Though no major incidents such as (Murders or Rapes) have occurred in the walkway, the quality of life issues have been a nuisance to the community for years and have taken a toll on nearby residents.

While conducting a study of crimes and Police calls for service for the area over the last two years, one of the residences in the area that has been hit the hardest due to the walkway is the residence located at 14607 Brand Blvd. This particular residence is directly adjacent to the walkway with its east side wall of the residence being directly next to the walkway. Because of its close proximity and easy access to and from the walkway, suspects can easily jump onto the property from the walkway and victimize the location. In the last two years, this residence has been the victim of (1) residential burglary, (1) grand theft auto, and (1) theft of outside Air Conditioning parts.

I feel the closure of this walkway would benefit the nearby residents and would improve the quality of life in the area.
