This policy has been proposed for many years and last year we both spoke in favor of the policy when it was on the committee's agenda at that time. However, due to a previous commitment, we will be unable to personally speak at your upcoming meeting on the 17th so are e-mailing our support to you at this time.

Neighborhood Councils are a wonderful opportunity for stakeholders to take an active part in the governing of their communities. However, if they are to remain a viable and integral part of the varied communities that make up the network of Los Angeles neighborhoods, then they must change and evolve to meet the diverse needs of the populations that they serve. If they cannot change to meet the needs of their stakeholders, then they will become stagnant and no longer effective. When neighborhood councils were first formed, many smaller communities were lumped together to form one large neighborhood council. However, sometimes one smaller community can change and grow and the needs of their stakeholders are no longer met. Allowing for subdivision will address this issue.

We live in the Hermon neighborhood which is in the Northeast Los Angeles area. Over the past years, our neighborhood has become very proactive and we have a great deal of active support and participation from the local stakeholders. We certainly would have the support and participation to form our own council which would then be able to address the specific concerns and needs of all Hermon stakeholders.
