ADOPT the accompanying RESOLUTION to include in the City's 2013-14 State Legislative Program SUPPORT for or SPONSORSHIP of legislation which would limit the use of civil compromise, extend the statute of limitations in incidents where a hit-and-run causes a fatal or severe injury, and increase the penalties for individuals who commit a hit-and-run, including the possible hold or forfeiture of vehicles involved in hit-and-runs and automatic license penalties.
