



MEMO TO FILE

The Mayor supports the policy position reflected in the resolution approved by your Honorable Body on May 21, 2013. However, in the spirit of upholding the City Charter – approved by the voters of Los Angeles – which delegates intergovernmental relations authority to the Executive Branch with the sole exception of positions on "legislation proposed to or pending before the state or federal government," the Mayor is returning this file without signature, with the understanding that this item will be considered deemed approved.

RULES, ELECTIONS AND INTERGOVERNMENTAL RELATIONS COMMITTEE REPORT and RESOLUTION relative to the City's position to support consideration by the Los Angeles County Metropolitan Transit Authority (Metro) of a transit option on Sepulveda Boulevard.

Recommendation for Council action, pursuant to Resolution (LaBonge – Koretz), SUBJECT TO THE CONCURRENCE OF THE MAYOR:

ADOPT the accompanying RESOLUTION to include in the City's 2013-14 State Legislative Program, SUPPORT for Metro to reopen consideration of a transit option on Sepulveda Boulevard for the East San Fernando Valley Transit Corridor Project.

<u>Fiscal Impact Statement</u>: None submitted by the Chief Legislative Analyst (CLA). The City Administrative Officer has not completed a financial analysis of this report.

Community Impact Statement: None submitted.

Summary:

At its regular meeting of May 17, 2013, the Rules, Elections and Intergovernmental Relations Committee considered a CLA report dated May 10, 2013 and Resolution (LaBonge – Koretz) relative to the City's position to support Metro reopening consideration of a transit option on Sepulveda Boulevard for the East San Fernando Valley Transit Corridor Project. The CLA report, attached to Council File No. 13-0002-S71, provides a summary of the Resolution and additional background information.

After providing an opportunity for public comment, the Committee recommended that Council adopt the accompanying Resolution. This matter is now forwarded to Council for its consideration.

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, any official position of the City of Los Angeles with respect to legislation, rules, regulations or policies proposed to or pending before, a local, state or federal governmental body or agency must have first been adopted in the form of a Resolution by the City Council with the concurrence of the Mayor; and

WHEREAS, on April 5, 2013, the Council took an action to Note and File report by the Department of Transportation relative to the status of the East San Fernando Valley Transit Corridor project; and

WHEREAS, this project is being developed by the Los Angeles County Metropolitan Transportation Authority (Metro) in partnership with the City of Los Angeles; and

WHEREAS, Metro completed a planning study (Alternatives Analysis) for the project, which was received by the Metro Board of Directors in January 2013; and

WHEREAS, a total of thirty alternatives were screened during the Alternatives Analysis phase of the project; and

WHEREAS, the following two alternatives have been chosen for further study in the draft environmental impact statement/report (DEIS/DEIR) phase of the project:

- A bus rapid transit option connecting the Sylmar Metrolink Station to the Metro Orange Line Van Nuys Station primarily via Van Nuys Boulevard.
- An at-grade light rail alternative from the Sylmar Metrolink Station on Van Nuys Boulevard/San Fernando road to either the Orange Line Van Nuys Station or Ventura Boulevard.

WHEREAS, in order to provide the best transportation link, Metro should re-open consideration of a transit option on Sepulveda Boulevard in the San Fernando Valley;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, with the concurrence of the Mayor, that by the adoption of this Resolution, the City of Los Angeles hereby includes in the 2013-14 State Legislative Program SUPPORT for the Los Angeles County Metropolitan Transportation Authority (Metro) to re-open consideration of a transit option on Sepulveda Boulevard for the East San Fernando Valley Transit Corridor Project.
