ADOPT the accompanying RESOLUTION to include in the City's 2013-14 State Legislative Program SUPPORT for AB 156 (Holden), which would expand the provisions under state law authorizing the interception of wire or electronic communications, to apply if a judge determines that there is probable cause that a suspect is involved in human trafficking.
