DISCUSSION

This donation is being offered as a result of a negotiated court settlement between the Environmental Protection Agency and AT&T. This equipment will be deployed by the Incident Command Post Unit (ICPU), Emergency Operations Division (EOD), to enhance operational capabilities of hazardous devices and materials investigations in Emergency Services Division, officer-involved shooting investigations conducted by Force Investigation Division, high profile investigations conducted by Robbery-Homicide Division, Special Weapons and Tactics personnel in Metropolitan Division, and patrol personnel under Office of Operations. Requests to accept the emergency trailer were discussed with Automotive Supervisor Dirk Aubuchon, Motor Transport Division (MTD). It was requested that MTD accept the emergency response trailer into the fleet in place of an aged existing 15-foot generator trailer bearing Shop Number 52080. The replacement of the old 15-foot generator trailer with the newer emergency response trailer would make this a cost-neutral request and would not expand the existing inventory of vehicles assigned to EOD.

No expressed or implied commitments or promises were made to the donor or representatives of the donor. The donor will not receive any preferential treatment, endorsement, or recommendation; and the donor is not allowed the use of any Los Angeles Police Department patents.
