PUBLIC SAFETY COMMITTEE REPORT relative to a monetary donation to support overtime for Los Angeles Police Department (LAPD) detectives assigned to Valley Crisis and Recovery Services (CARES) Family Justice Center.

Recommendation for Council action:

AUTHORIZE LAPD to accept a monetary donation in the amount of \$35,000 from the Los Angeles Police Foundation to support overtime for LAPD detectives assigned to the Valley CARES Family Justice Center, and THANK the donor for this generous gift.

Fiscal Impact Statement: None submitted. Neither the City Administrative Officer nor the Chief Legislative Analyst has completed a financial analysis of this report.

Community Impact Statement: None submitted.

SUMMARY

In a report to the Board of Police Commissioners dated March 15, 2013 (attached to the Council file), LAPD requests authority to accept a monetary donation to support overtime for detectives assigned to the Valley CARES Family Justice Center in the Van Nuys Area. LAPD believes that this project will achieve key outcomes to improve victim safety and reduce the risk of lethality by enhancing the efficiency and strength of the service delivery system for victims of domestic violence. As Valley CARES sustains increases in successful prosecution for domestic violence cases involving strangulation and/or sexual assault, LAPD will expand training, community outreach, and education to other parts of the City. On March 19, 2013, the Board approved LAPD's request.

At its meeting held April 12, 2013, the Public Safety Committee recommended that Council authorize LAPD to accept this donation, as recommended by the Board of Police Commissioners.
