PUBLIC SAFETY COMMITTEE REPORT relative to the Fiscal Year (FY) 2013 Emergency Management Performance grant award for use by the Emergency Management Department (EMD).

Recommendations for Council action, SUBJECT TO THE APPROVAL OF THE MAYOR:

AUTHORIZE the General Manager, EMD, or designee, to:

- 1. Accept the FY 2013 Emergency Management Performance grant award in the amount of \$615,363 from the Federal Emergency Management Agency for the grant performance period of July 1, 2013 to June 30, 2014.
- 2. Execute the subrecipient agreement (attached to the Council file), between the City of Los Angeles and the County of Los Angeles, in the amount of \$615,363 for a term of July 1, 2013 to June 30, 2014, for the acceptance of the Emergency Management Performance grant award, subject to the approval of the City Attorney as to form and legality.
- 3. Deposit the Emergency Management Performance grant award funds received under the subrecipient agreement into the General Fund 100/35, Revenue Source Code 3702, Emergency Management Assistance.
- 4. Prepare Controller instructions for any technical adjustments consistent with this action, subject to the approval of the City Administrative Officer (CAO); and, AUTHORIZE the Controller to implement the instructions.

<u>Fiscal Impact Statement</u>: The CAO reports that this action will not impact the General Fund. Acceptance of the FY 2013 Emergency Management Performance grant award in the amount of \$615,363 will provide support for the City's emergency management programs. The above recommendations are in compliance with City financial policies in that grant funds are sufficient to support the grant activities.

Community Impact Statement: None submitted.

SUMMARY

In a report to the Mayor and Council dated March 21, 2014 (attached to the Council file), the CAO states that the EMD requests authority to accept the FY 2013 Emergency Management Performance grant award in the amount of \$615,363 from the Department of Homeland Security. The EMD also requests authority to execute a subrecipient agreement with the Countyof Los Angeles to receive the City's portion of the EMPG. Grant program match requirements have been met through General Funded emergency management expenses. According to the CAO, the purpose of this program is to sustain and improve comprehensive emergency management programs at the state, tribal, and local levels from all man-made and natural disasters through the prevention, mitigation, response and recovery of all hazards events. The CAO recommends approval of EMD's requests.

At its meeting held March 28, 2014, the Public Safety Committee recommended that Council authorize EMD to accept this grant award, and to take the related actions above, as

recommended by the CAO.
