REQUEST FOR QUALIFICATIONS (RFQ)

INTRODUCTION

The Department of Cultural Affairs (DCA) is seeking artists and artist teams interested in creating permanent and/or temporary art projects for large-scale, outdoor walls in the City of LA. This Request for Qualifications (RFQ) is open to professional artists working in any medium, style or technique—i.e. murals, aerosol, mosaics, paints, stencils, stickers, wheatpasting, woodblocking, light and/or video projection.

CRITERIA

Successful artists must demonstrate the vision, past experience and professional qualifications required to create public art for City walls—a process that includes public presentations, production oversight and execution of artwork in the public realm. Team applications should demonstrate the qualifications of its individual team members, as well as their qualifications to work together on projects. Commissioned artists and/or artist teams must attend multiple meetings with City agencies, the public and others as required.

ELIGIBILITY

This RFQ is open to professional artists and artist teams living and working in the County of Los Angeles. Applicants selected through this RFQ will be included on DCA's 2014 Pre-Qualified Roster of Wall Artists, and be eligible to propose for individual project opportunities as they arise, but will not be guaranteed a public art commission. Artist teams must retain the same members as stated in their application to this RFQ, in order to remain on the 2014 Roster established through this RFQ. Artists and artist teams pre-qualified for other DCA-administered public art opportunities are not prevented from applying. Employees of the City of Los Angeles are ineligible to apply.

PROJECT BUDGETS

Project budgets will range from \$5,000 to \$300,000. Each budget will be all-inclusive and must cover all expenses associated with the design, fabrication and installation of a commissioned public art project, including design development, production and execution, as well as any required presentations, approvals, engineering services and/or City permits. Project funding sources may include the Arts Development Fee Program, the Proposition Q Citywide Public Safety Bond Program and/or other arts program(s) administered by DCA.

SELECTION PROCESS

An artist selection panel will convene to review applications received in response to this RFQ, and select up to twenty-five (25) artists and/or artist teams for the 2014 Pre-Qualified Roster of Wall Artists. The Roster will remain active for three (3) years from the date of selection. As individual projects are initiated by DCA, pre-qualified artists and artist teams will be eligible to propose for specific public art opportunities. Separate selection panels,

convened for each of these individual projects, will review artists' proposals, interview artists and select artists to receive public art commissions. All selection panels will be administered by DCA, and be comprised of artists, arts professionals, City representatives and/or community members. Upon receiving a public art project commission, and throughout all phases of the project, each commissioned artist or artist team will be required to comply with all City codes dealing with safety, accessibility, seismic and/or other issues as appropriate for each project.

including name, business name (if applicable), physical address, mailing address, telephone and email. Teams must identify one artist to be DCA's primary contact, as well as contact information for each artist on the team.

STATEMENT OF INTEREST

(PDF or DOC format only, 2 pages max) in creating public art for City walls.

CURRICULUM VITAE

(PDF or DOC format only, 4 pages max); teams must submit a CV for each artist on the team.

TEN (10) IMAGES

(JPG format only, 72 DPI min and 2 MB max per file) of completed artwork; image files must be labeled sequentially (i.e. 01, 02, 03...); teams may submit no more than 10 images total.

IMAGE LIST

(PDF or DOC format only) numbered to correspond with the image files; provide the title, year, size, materials and a brief artwork description for each image; for any commissioned project(s), also include the client, budget and location.
