
MOTION

In 1961, fast food pioneer John Galardi opened the first Der Wienerschnitzel restaurant on Pacific Coast Highway in the Los Angeles community of Wilmington. The walk-up food stand and drive-thru has been in continuous operation since it opened and is still intact. The Wienerschnitzel chain has grown to include 933 locations nationwide. This Der Wienerschnitzel preceded the signature A-frame design of the chain and epitomized the drive-thru restaurant concept made popular in the 1960s, strongly associated with Los Angeles' car culture.

I THEREFORE MOVE that the original Der Wienerschnitzel restaurant located at 1362 Gulf Avenue at Pacific Coast Highway in Council District 15 be designated a Historic-Cultural Monument per LAAC 22.171.10 and instruct the Planning Department to prepare a nomination which delineates the historical and cultural significance of the property.

I FURTHER MOVE that the Cultural Heritage Commission be instructed to present its findings in 90 days to the Planning and Land Use management Committee for its review and consideration.


