Andrew Glazier is the Managing Director, Impact and Strategy for City Year Los Angeles, a national, AmeriCorps affiliated non-profit that is focused on improving public education and addressing the dropout crisis through national service. As Managing Director for City Year Los Angeles (CYLA), Andrew oversees all aspects of CYLA's program and service in our partner schools.

In the 2015-2016 program year, 309 AmeriCorps members are serving over 10,000 students in grades 3 - 10 as tutors and mentors in 26 schools across the Los Angeles Unified School District. During his tenure in the position, he has overseen growth in the organization that has more than doubled the number of CYLA AmeriCorps members serving in Los Angeles and grown CYLA into the largest full-time AmeriCorps program in California. In addition, he manages local and state government relations, including over \$5 million in contracts with AmeriCorps and the LAUSD.

Andrew has been active in Los Angeles local government and business for the past 15 years. Prior to joining City Year, he worked in diverse public and private sectors including real estate finance and construction, political strategy, education and government.

In addition, Andrew serves as a Vice-President of the Los Angeles Board of Fire Commissioners, which oversees the Los Angeles Fire Department. He was appointed by Mayor Eric Garcetti to the post in 2013.

Andrew received his MBA from UCLA Anderson School of Management in 2006, and was a Coro Fellow in the 1999-2000 class. He graduated from Pomona College with a B.A. in International Relations, with a focus on the Pacific Rim.

Andrew was born and raised in Los Angeles, and is a 4th generation Angeleno with a family history of service in Los Angeles.
