RE: Motion to put anti Citizens United measure on LA City Ballot - SUPPORT

Dear Councilmember _____

On behalf of California Common Cause and CALPIRG, please accept this letter of support for Councilmember Alarcon's motion; which would place the question of overturning *Citizens United* on the ballot for the May Municipal Election.

We fully supported the resolution the City Council passed on December 6, 2011 calling for an amendment to the constitution to overturn *Citizens United* and state that corporations are not people. We further supported the Council's vote on January 16th to ask the City Attorney to draft the ballot language. We urge City Council to approve this ballot measure– voters in Los Angeles should have a chance to weigh in on this important political issue of our time.

This past November, the state of Colorado and Montana; many parts of Massachusetts; cities of San Francisco, Richmond, Chicago and more passed initiatives that did just that by margins of over 72% or higher. We believe the more voters who speak at the ballot– the more Congress will have to listen to the overwhelming call for reforming our broken campaign finance system and reclaiming democracy and elections for people.

California Common Cause and CALPIRG strongly support putting this on the ballot because the US Supreme Court's decision in *Citizens United* has allowed a torrent of unlimited special interest funds into our federal elections, undermining the integrity of our political system and the principle of one person one vote. This initiative would call for the United States Congress to restore constitutional rights and fair elections back to the people and call for an end to corporate personhood.

Dear Councilmember Koretz:

The South Robertson Neighborhoods Council requests that the City of Los Angeles join with other municipalities across the nation in passing a non-binding resolution which calls for amending the U.S. Constitution to firmly establish that money is not speech and that human beings, not corporations, are entitled to constitutional rights.

On January 21, 2010, with its ruling in Citizens United v. Federal Election Commission, the Supreme Court ruled that corporations are persons, entitled by the U.S. Constitution to unduly influence elections.

The South Robertson Neighborhoods Council members believe that the Supreme Court is misguided in principle, and wrong on the law. In a democracy, the authority of the government is derived from its citizens and as such, the citizens rule. If we wish to limit corporate campaign contributions, it is our right to do so.

We agree with Justice John Paul Stevens who stated in his dissenting opinion that the Court's opinion is "a rejection of the common sense of the American people, who have recognized a need to prevent corporations from undermining self government since the founding, and who have fought against the distinctive corrupting potential of corporate electioneering since the days of Theodore Roosevelt. . .While American democracy is imperfect, few outside the majority of this Court would have thought its flaws included a dearth of corporate money in politics."
