### RE: 13-1339, Mexican Elderberry / Toyon - Support adding to Protected Tree List; Further support for change of metric used for determining size of shrubs included for protection

To: Planning and Land Use Management Committee, Public Works and Gang Reduction Committee, and City Council

Friends of Griffith Park previously submitted support for Council File 13-1339 (July 10, 2019). We fully support adding the two species to the current protected tree species list, per that letter.

We would like to add that the current Urban Forestry Division (UFD) proposal for measuring protected toyon and elderberry is unacceptable (2 inches at 4.5 feet height). The plant morphology of both species, deemed to be shrubs by UFD, often presents with multiple trunks. The cumulative diameter method is the best solution for measurement. This is the same metric used for the current protected species. First, by using this method the language remains standardized across all species, and second, for protection purposes it makes sense to measure cumulatively for these two added species. Second, "multiple trunking" is prevalent with toyon and elderberry, just as it is for protected species already listed, especially Southern California black walnut and bay laurel.

We are aware that another measurement standard of 2 inches at 2.5 feet above ground was offered by UFD, and the compromise was agreed upon by Community Forest Advisory Committee, an advisory group we trust. However, Friends of Griffith Park would prefer to support a cumulative diameter measurement 4 inches at 4.5 feet height above ground. It makes much more sense!

As our previous letter states, we are very concerned about loss of these important species to brush clearance practices. We ask you adopt the protection of these two species and adopt them with the same standard of measurement as the others.
